COVID-19 update	<p>Dr. Cieslak presented on current status of COVID-19 in Oregon.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cases • Variant circulation – no Omicron in OR as yet • Age and hospitalizations • Deaths • Hospital and ICU occupancy • Vaccine doses administered and people vaccinated • Cases by vaccination status
Update on 2020-21 exemptions and back to school plans for 2021-22	<p>Most students were in distance learning most of the year. Enforcement was different:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Many exclusion orders were not enforced in February because of distance learning. • Exclusion enforced upon in-person return <p>From 2020 to 2021, enrollment decreased:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 14% in kindergarten (6,391 fewer students) • 4% in grades K-12 (26,645 fewer students)

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 8% in total school and child care populations (54,337 fewer children) <p>School and child care immunization rates in Oregon remain high, even though the COVID-19 pandemic has created barriers to accessing care.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Kindergarten nonmedical exemptions dropped in 2021 <p>Rates for vaccines administered pre-pandemic for kindergarteners increased.</p> <p>Rates for vaccines administered for kindergarten in 2020-21 school year decreased.</p> <p>Continue to monitor data as schools return to normal process for 2021-22 school year.</p> <p>Ongoing work toward equitable outcomes.</p>
<p>Boost Oregon: Effective messaging to parents of children ages 5-11</p>	<p>Lillian Labs and Dialsmith presented on second-phase survey. Phase one was adult messaging, presented in March.</p> <p>National survey with 230 parents</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • At least one child 5-10 years • Chosen to vaccinate selves <p>Focus on tentative and nervous respondents (likelihood to vaccinate right away)</p> <p>Similar concerns and questions across board</p> <p>Tested 5 distinct message themes</p> <p>Discussion:</p> <p>With existing vaccines, no major reactions showed up after two months in their roll-out.</p> <p>Trusted sources categories – do they take into account that provider definitions vary regionally?</p> <p>Have been several studies about COVID’s effects on fertility</p> <p>Data to follow</p>
