

IMMUNIZATION ADMINISTRATION FOR OREGON DENTISTS - A QUICK-START GUIDE

Oregon legislation permits dentists to vaccinate their patients. The Oregon Administrative Rule for dental administration of vaccine, <u>OAR 410-123-1262</u>, includes vaccination administration requirements. These include:

- Using the routine immunization schedules published by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, available for children and adults.
- Follow OHA approved <u>Model Standing Orders</u> for vaccine administration and treatment of adverse events.
- Provide a copy of the current <u>Vaccine Information Statement (VIS)</u> to the patient or their representative for each vaccine administered. Links to instructions and translations are available here.
- Report adverse events to the federal Vaccine Adverse Events Reporting System (VAERS).
- Oregon administrative rules also require reporting adverse events to the Oregon Board of Dentistry within 10 business days.
- Report vaccine administration to the <u>ALERT Immunization Information System (IIS)</u> within 14 days.

A dental practice interested in vaccinating may also wish to participate in the Vaccines for Children program (VFC), which supplies federally purchased vaccines to participating health care providers at no cost, for immunizing eligible children through age 18.
