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## Fact Sheet – OAR 333-200-0010 and 0080 Exhibit 3: Oregon Hospital Trauma Team Activation Criteria

Effective date: October 15, 2024 Implementation date: October 15, 2024

The Oregon Health Authority, Public Health Division, EMS & Trauma Systems (EMS & TS) program has permanently amended Exhibit 3 (Oregon Hospital Trauma Team Activation Criteria) in Oregon Administrative Rules chapter 333, division 200 to align with the revised, 2021 National Guideline for Field Triage of Injured Patients and the 2022 Resources for Optimal Care of the Injured Patient.

## **Two Triage Categories**

- 1. Full Trauma Team
- 2. Modified Trauma Team

## What's New in Full Trauma Criteria

- Confirmed blood pressure less than 90 mmHg at any time in adults, and age-specific hypotension in children aged 0-9 years less than 70 mmHg + (2 x age years)
- Patients intubated in the field and directly transported to the trauma center
- Patients who have respiratory compromise or are in need of an emergent airway

## What's New in Modified Trauma Criteria

- Moved from Full to Modified:
  - o Chest wall instability, deformity, or suspected flail chest
  - Suspected spinal cord injury with motor sensory deficit
  - o Skull deformity, suspected skull fracture
  - O Suspected fracture of two or more proximal long bones (humerus or femur)
- Added falls from a height greater than 10 feet (all ages)
- Added high-risk auto crash: need for extrication for entrapped patient
- Added child (age 0-9 years) unrestrained or in unsecured child safety seat
- Removed MPH criteria:
  - o Pedestrian/bicycle rider thrown, run over, or with significant impact
  - Rider separated from transport vehicle with significant impact (e.g., motorcycle, ATV, horse, etc.)
- Moved comorbid factors into Modified Trauma Team under Consider Risk factors
- Added suspicion of child abuse
- Added special, high-resource healthcare needs
- Removed EMS provider judgement
