The new hospital will improve the standard of care. St. Charles is providing health related services and education at a free or discounted rate to the patients who meet the criteria of its charity care policy. Collection/payment policies are the same for all patients. St. Charles criteria for the determination for charity care include the patients or other responsible party's annual household income, number of people in the home and claimed on taxes, assets, credit history, existing medical debt obligations and other indicators of the patients ability to pay. Generally those individuals with a household income at less than 100% of the federal poverty guidelines qualify for charity care. In addition St. Charles provides discounts on a sliding scale to those individuals with an annual household income of between 200% and 400% of the federal poverty guidelines. St. Charles does not pursue collection of amounts determined to qualify as charity care.

6. In what ways may this project negatively impact the community that your facility serves? Include direct cost such as bonds as well as indirect impacts such as service interruptions. Attach additional pages if needed.

The only negative impact will be the Prineville Family Care Clinic will be closed for one day to move from the old facility to the new one. There will be no other service interruptions.
