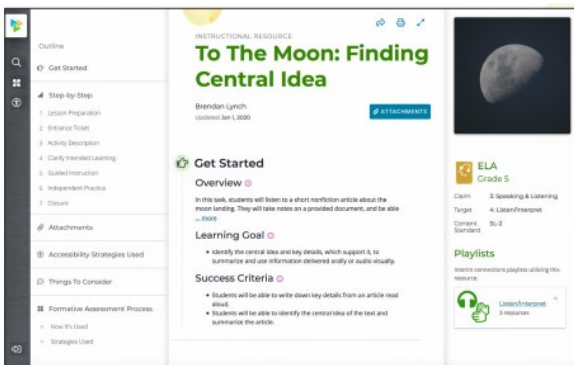
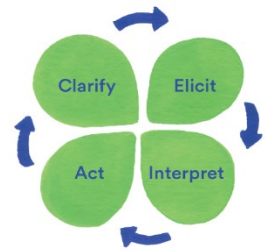


Teaching, Learning, and Assessment Tools for Addressing Students' Unfinished Learning

As businesses and non-profits promote their learning tools to your schools, please remember that high quality, ODE-endorsed free tools are already available for your students and educators. We've collected many of them into this document to help districts and schools.

Tools for Teachers contains educator-created lessons, activities, strategies and professional development resources tailored to help educators meet students' learning needs in English language arts and mathematics.

All resources are designed around the formative assessment process, which helps educators identify where students are in their learning, where they are going and how they will get there.



Tools for Teachers provides access to a variety of resources, including:

- Student performance progressions.
- Connections Playlists that seamlessly link to Oregon's interim assessments
- Formative assessment strategies to help teachers identify where students are in their learning, where they are going and how they will get there.

Oregon Open Learning is Oregon's hub for Open Educational Resources (OER).

Oregon Open Learning is a digital resource repository and collaboration space for educators, administrators and other educational partners to create, remix and share OER. The hub provides a space for sharing high quality, up-to-date and relevant learning materials for many content and focus areas. Because many OER can be remixed and adapted, resources can be differentiated for a diverse student body, localized to specific contexts and expanded to integrate a variety of disciplinary knowledge and skills. As a result, the Oregon Open Learning Hub will continue to evolve as additional resources are added by Oregon's educational community.





[Oregon's Interim Assessment System](#) for ELA and math provides small, flexible, just-in-time assessment blocks that can quickly help educators identify what students know and can do.

Oregon's interim assessments are making a difference! See their impact in [North Santiam School District](#).

The interim assessments are:

- **Flexible** – administration options support the use of individual items during instruction, or more formal assessment of learning
- **Comprehensive** – interims can be used to measure students' knowledge and skills in grade levels other than their enrolled grade
- **Aligned** – interims are aligned to the same claims and targets as Oregon's summative assessments, and they include the same suite of [accessibility tools](#) that maximize all students' opportunity to engage
- **Rigorous** – items reflect the range of Depth of Knowledge (DOK) described in the Oregon State Standards
- **Responsive** – the reporting system allows educators to view students' individual responses to test questions, as well as quickly see the "Top 5" class strengths and needs for additional supports.

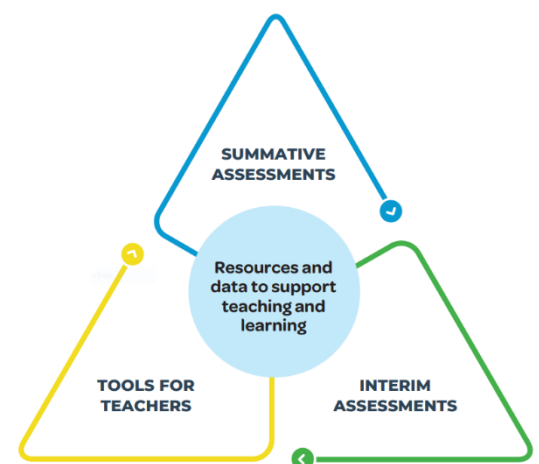
