



Creative Generation Survey to Inform Creative Youth Development Programs

On Wednesday, March 18, 2020, Creative Generation deployed a fast response survey to gather data about the rapidly changing funding needs of arts & cultural education organizations, investigating the potential responses which could mitigate the impacts of impending challenges. Read more about this survey and its findings here.

After two years, the organization intends to revisit these needs and examine if and how they have changed. The survey includes questions both about the perspectives of programs and funders' capacities to fund Creative Youth Development programs. With the collected data, Creative Generation will provide an updated snapshot of the alignments between funding opportunities and the needs of practitioners in the field.
