Charge to the subcommittee

The subcommittee is charged with resuming the discussion on average weekly wage for low-income workers issues within the Oregon workers' compensation system, including the proposals in SB705 (2025), as was agreed when the full committee recommended to create the subcommittee at the May 1, 2025 meeting.

The first subcommittee meeting will be held on Friday, May 23rd at 10:30am. The meeting will be virtual, however in-person meeting is available at the Labor & Industries Building, Conference Room 260, 350 Winter Street NE, Salem, Oregon.

Subcommittee agendas, meeting notes, audio recordings, and other materials will be posted on the MLAC website.


