CPS.03 Time to Initial Contact -- Target: Greater than (GT) 95%

CPS. 02 Assessments Completed in Time, of those due -- Target: Greater than (GT) 90%

CV.01 Months Worker-Child Visit Made – of mos. Child in care entire month – Target: Greater than (GT) 95%.

SA.01 (Fed) Maltreatment in Foster Care – National Standard Target: Less than (LT) 8.5 victimizations per 100,000 days in care.

SA.02 (Fed) Recurrence of Maltreatment in 12 mos. -- National Standard Target: Less than (LT) 9.1%

PA.04 (Fed) Re-Entry to Foster care –National Standard Target: Less than (LT) 8.3%

PA.05 (Fed) Placement Stability – National Standard Target: Less than (LT) 4.12 moves per 1,000 days in foster care

PA.01 (Fed) Permanency in 12 Months – National Standard Target: Greater than (GT) 40.5%

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CPS.03 Time to Initial Contact— Percent of reports referred for Investigation (and Family Assessments) that had an initial child contact within the required response time (24 hours or within 5 days) of receiving the report. Attempted Contact is included in the measure. Data are monthly.
Target: Greater than (GT) 95%

CPS. 02 Traditional and Alternative Response Completed in Time, of those due —This report shows the percent of accepted reports for CPS Investigations (and Family Assessments) that reached the investigation due date according to agency policy that were completed within the required time for those due during the time period selected. They will not show on the report until the month they are due. Data are monthly.
Target: Greater than (GT) 90%.

CV.01 Months Worker-Child Visit Made – of mos. Child in care entire month – This report shows the percent of visit months for children in foster care the entire month who had at least one face-to-face visit during each month. To be counted in this measure a child must be in care the entire month. To be in foster care the entire month means that the child was in foster care at least part of the last day of the previous month and first day of the next month. Visit months can be added across other Report Periods and represent visit months, not unique children. Children that are in a federal episode are counted as in foster care even if that child is in runaway or trail home visit status. Data are monthly.
Target: Greater than (GT) 95%

SA.01 (Fed) Maltreatment in Foster Care – Rate of victimization per 100,000 days of foster care for all children in foster care during a rolling 12 month target period. Calculation: Number of founded reports of maltreatment by any perpetrator during any foster care episode within the rolling 12-month period divided by the number of days that children were in foster care during a 12-month rolling period and multiplied by 100,000. Data are a moving 12-month period. **National Standard: Less than (LT) 8.5 victimizations per 100,000 days in care.**

SA.02 (Fed) Recurrence of Maltreatment in 12 mos – Percent of children who had at least one founded report of maltreatment in a rolling 12-month target period that also had an additional founded report of maltreatment within 12 months of their initial report. The 12-Month Target Period is the first 12 months of the 2-year measurement period ending in the reporting period. The report received date is used to determine if a child is counted in the 12-month target period and is used to determine whether maltreatment recurrence occurred within 12 months. Subsequent reports are not counted as a recurrence if the subsequent report of maltreatment was within 14 days of the earlier report or if it has the same incident date as the earlier report. Reports of youth age 18 or more are excluded from the calculation. Data are a moving 12-month period. **National Standard: Less than (LT) 9.1%**

PA.04 (Fed) Re-Entry to Foster care – The percent of children that re-entered foster care within 12 months of discharge out of all children who entered foster care in a 12-month target period and discharged within 12 months to reunification, living with a relative(s), or guardianship. The 12-month target period is the first 12 months of a three-year measurement period presented in rolling 12-month periods. Report includes children who entered foster care in the 12-month target period and discharged to reunification with parents or primary caretakers, living with other relative(s), or guardianship. Report excludes children who entered foster care at or after age 18 or were in a foster care episode lasting less than 8 days. The time in trial home visits exceeding 30 days is subtracted from the length of stay in foster care if the child discharges to

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reunification or other relative. A child with multiple removal episodes can be counted more than once. Data are a moving 12-month period.

National Standard: Less than (LT) 8.3%

PA.05 (Fed) Placement Stability – The rate of placement moves per 1,000 days in foster care for children who entered foster care during a rolling 12-Month Period (including days in trial home visit and days across removal episodes) minus days where the child was age 18 or over and minus days in foster care episodes lasting less than 8 days during the rolling 12-Month Period. The target period is the rolling 12-Month Period that ends on the report period end date. Number of moves are the number times a child changes a placement setting within a removal episode that is required to be counted in AFCARS. Both the days in care and placement moves are counted even when the child is in multiple removal episodes in the same year. Data are a moving 12-month period. **National Standard: Less than (LT) 4.12 moves per 1,000 days in foster care**

PA.01 (Fed) Permanency in 12 Months – Percent of children who enter foster care in a 12-month target period that discharged to permanency within 12 months of entering foster care. Discharge to Permanency includes discharge to reunification with parents or primary caretakers, living with other relative(s), adoption and guardianship. Report excludes youth who enter foster care at or after age 18 and removal episodes lasting less than 8 days. The time in trial home visits exceeding 30 days is subtracted from the length of stay in foster care if the child discharges to reunification or other relative. For children with multiple foster care episodes in the 12-month period, this report will use the first episode reported data for all episodes. Data are a moving 12-month period. **National Standard: Greater than (GT) 40.5%**

PA.02 Permanency in 12 Months of those in Foster Care 12-23 Months - Percent of all children in foster care on the first day of a 12 month period who had been in foster care (in that episode) between 12 and 23 months that discharged from foster care to permanency within 12 months of the first day of the 12-month period. The cohort of children looks back to the first day of the month 12 months prior to the report period displayed (rolling 12-month periods). Permanency is a discharge to reunification with parents or primary caretakers, living with other relative(s), adoption or guardianship. Report excludes youth who are age 18 or more on the first day of the 12 month period. Data are a moving 12-month period. **National Standard: Greater than (GT) 43.6%**

PA.03 Permanency in 12 Months of those in Foster Care 24+ Months – Percent of all children in foster care on the first day of a 12 month period, who had been in foster care (in that episode) for 24 months or more, that discharged to permanency within 12 months of the first day of the 12 month period. The cohort of children looks back to the first day of the month 12 months prior to the report period displayed (rolling 12 month periods). Permanency is a discharge to reunification with parents or primary caretakers, living with other relative(s), adoption and guardianship. This report excludes youth age 18 or more on the first day of the 12 month period. Data are a moving 12-month period. **National Standard: Greater than (GT) 30.3%**

Level - The term used to represent the area in which a child is served. The Level information is based on a child's primary worker branch location. For CPS data, Central Office represents work covered by the Office of Abuse Prevention and Investigations (OAAPI) group; for Foster Care data, Central Office represents the occurrence when a child is progressing to adoption and the primary worker is a central office adoptions worker. Unknown County represents the occurrence when the worker assignment has a gap in the assignment dates.
