<a href="#">APD-IM-16-046</a>	05/16/16	<b>New Online APD CA/PS Basics Trainings Available on the Learning Center</b> - A new CA/PS Basics online training is now available on the Learning Center for case managers. This training was previously offered in a two day classroom setting and has been converted to ten (10) separate modules. The in-person CA/PS Basics training has been discontinued. <a href="#">APD-PT-16-020</a>	5/26/16	<b>Homecare workers acting as consumer representatives</b> - Beginning June 1, 2016, no new Medicaid in-home service or OPI case may be opened for any consumer who selects a representative who is also the consumer's homecare worker, regardless of any other relationship the consumer and homecare worker may have. If no suitable representative is available to the consumer, case managers shall offer the consumer service benefits in other long-term or community-based care settings, and offer the services from in-home agencies (if available). <a href="#">APD-AR-16-039</a>	6/7/16	<b>Oregon Project Independence and Medicaid Eligibility</b> - Using the database of consumer information found in Oregon Access and MMIS, APD is now creating a report APD 1091 monthly to identify consumers who are coded for both a full Medicaid program (usually OSIPM but also includes MAGI) and OPI. If the consumer is on "full" Medicaid and wants to continue to receive "full" Medicaid, the OPI services must be closed according to AAA procedure. The report is not showing those consumers who have SNAP or a Medicare Savings Program only (e.g. P2 QMB, P2 SMB or P2 SMF) and OPI. See transmittal for details.
