The easiest way to support your passion is to pledge online today ([ecfd.oregon.gov](http://ecfd.oregon.gov)) and make a payroll contribution gift. If you have given in past years, consider increasing your pledge—even \$1 more per month will have a big impact.

Then, go online to [ecfd.oregon.gov](http://ecfd.oregon.gov), and click "Pledge Now." # Your Questions, Answered

## WHAT IS THE CHARITABLE FUND DRIVE & WHY SHOULD I GIVE?

The State of Oregon Employees' Charitable Fund Drive is a once-a-year opportunity to support the nonprofits and issues you're passionate about. Giving through the Charitable Fund Drive is an easy way to spread your donations out over an entire year, using payroll contribution, and among multiple charities.

## WHO DOES IT BENEFIT?

Your Charitable Fund Drive donation, combined with those of thousands of your fellow State employees, means hundreds of thousands of dollars going to help Oregonians in every part of the state. This makes the Charitable Fund Drive a powerful tool to make lasting change in Oregon.

## HOW DO I FIND CHARITIES TO SUPPORT?

First, visit [ecfd.oregon.gov](http://ecfd.oregon.gov) and click "Pledge Now" to search for organizations that match your passions and values. You don't have to log in to search for and read about Charitable Fund Drive nonprofits; just use the "Charity Search Tool" on the main menu. Once you know which organizations you want to support, it's easy to log in and make your gift securely online.

The Charity Search Tool on [ecfd.oregon.gov](http://ecfd.oregon.gov) offers the most comprehensive information. However, if you prefer not to search online, use this booklet's list of the umbrella groups and their member charities.

You can donate to an issue by giving to an umbrella organization. You can also designate your gift to their individual member/grantee groups, or both! If you just can't choose a specific charity to support, you can still make a positive impact by giving to Undesignated Gifts (code 5000 if you're using a paper pledge form). Any funds given to Undesignated Gifts are split among all the statewide umbrella groups and the United Way or United Fund in the county where your workplace is located.

## DOES MY GIFT REALLY MAKE A DIFFERENCE?

Some people are reluctant to give to the Charitable Fund Drive, thinking "I can't give much; it wouldn't have an effect." In fact, Charitable Fund Drive gifts have a LARGER effect than you might realize, because they're pooled with the gifts of hundreds of other State employees. For example, a gift of just \$2 per month would bring art supplies to the bedside of a child receiving treatment for cancer. A gift of any size will be put to good use by any of the more than 850 charities in the Charitable Fund Drive.

## HOW DO I MAKE A PLEDGE?

You have two options for giving: you can **1)** pledge online or **2)** use the paper pledge form — found on the back of the employee brochure or at [ecfd.oregon.gov](http://ecfd.oregon.gov).

### ONLINE:

- 1) Go to the Charitable Fund Drive's state website: [ecfd.oregon.gov](http://ecfd.oregon.gov)
- 2) **Click on "Pledge Now"** on the right hand side of the page. There are separate pledge sites for State employees and University employees.



### 1) **Log in:**

- » Your Username/Login = your employee ID number, including the “OR” and all leading zeroes.
- » Your Password (if this is your first time logging in) = FIRSTNAMELASTNAME, in ALL CAPS (example: JANEDOE).

- 2) You will be asked for your email address and to confirm your state agency and location to update your profile.
- 3) Once logged in, returning Charitable Fund Drive online donors can repeat their 2015 pledge automatically, just by clicking “YES” in the “Replicate Your Last Pledge” box, then confirming your charity choices and donation amount, and clicking “Submit Pledge.”
- 4) **Search for charities:** Under “Main Menu,” click “Charity Search Tool” to search for specific charities or learn more about the umbrella groups that make up the Charitable Fund Drive. If you’re logged in, you can start selecting and pledging to charities instantly.

### **PAPER:**

- 1) **Use the pledge form on the Charitable Fund Drive brochure** all employees receive. If you did not receive one, ask your office’s Charitable Fund Drive Coordinator, or call (503) 636–4058 to request one, or download it from [ecfd.oregon.gov](http://ecfd.oregon.gov).
- 2) **Consult the charity list** starting on page 5 in this booklet to find the Charitable Fund Drive code numbers for your chosen charities. If you need more information about a charity, you can visit [ecfd.oregon.gov](http://ecfd.oregon.gov) and click on “Pledge Now” to search for charities without logging in.
- 3) **Complete and sign** your form, and **make a copy** for your records.
- 4) **Return the original** to your office’s Charitable Fund Drive Coordinator. If you don’t know who your coordinator is, call Deb Furry at (503) 636–4058.

## **WHAT DO I SAVE FOR TAX TIME?**

When you prepare your Federal and State income taxes, you can factor your charitable donations into your itemized tax deductions. Talk with a tax consultant if you need advice on charitable giving and how it can affect your taxes.

If you plan to itemize your deductions, **be sure to keep at least two of these pieces of documentation** listed below. Tax laws now require you to have more than one of these items, regardless of the dollar value of the gift:

- 1) A printed confirmation of your pledge—either from the online pledging system or a photocopy of your paper pledge form.
- 2) Your FINAL pay stub of the calendar year or W-2 form showing you had money deducted from your pay.
- 3) A letter/email from the Charitable Fund Drive confirming your donation or pledge was received.
- 4) Letters from the nonprofit organizations you pledged to, thanking you for your gift.

You can access your past online pledge history year-round at the “IPLEDGEONLINE” site (accessible via [ecfd.oregon.gov](http://ecfd.oregon.gov)). When you’re at the online pledging site, log in to the system, click “My Pledges and Profile,” then “My Pledges.”
