- *The Chair may limit time for testimony on any item and may set time limits (usually 3 minutes) for individual speakers*

Note: Because of the uncertain length of time needed, the Commission may deal with any item at any time in the meeting, except those set for a specific time. Anyone wishing to be heard on any item not having a set time should arrive when the meeting begins to avoid missing an item of interest. Topics not on the agenda may be introduced and discussed during the Director's Report, during the Commission's Business and Reports, or under Other.

Please note that in the Commission's efforts to hold their meetings around the state, staff may not be available to receive written comments (specifically emails) for agenda items within 48 hours before the meeting starts. OAR 660-001-0230(2): "Unless the director allows a closer deadline, written testimony must be submitted at least five days before the commission meeting to be provided to commission members in advance of the meeting." 1. **Possible Adoption of Metolius Basin Area of Critical State Concern, Management Plan and Area Map.** The Commission will continue deliberations from its meeting on Friday, March 13, 2009. At that meeting, the Commission agreed the basin should be designated an Area of Critical State Concern. Staff were directed to square up the boundary of Area 2 (buffer), and contact property owners of the two proposed destination resorts relative to the management plan. If the Commission decides to adopt the recommendation, it will then submit the decision to the legislature for its approval during the current legislative session. The Area of Critical State Concern, management plan and map do not take effect without legislative approval. 2. **Other.** The Commission reserves this time, if needed, for other business or for further consideration of any item on the agenda.

Oregon's seven-member Land Conservation and Development Commission, assisted by the Department of Land Conservation and Development (DLCD), adopts state land use goals, assures local plan compliance with the goals, coordinates state and local planning, and manages the coastal zone program. The Commissioners are unpaid citizen volunteers appointed by the Governor and confirmed by the Senate. Commissioners are appointed to four-year terms and may not serve for more than two consecutive terms. The statute establishing the Commission, ORS 197, also directs that members be representative of the state. The Commission meets approximately every six weeks to direct the work of the Department of Land Conservation and Development (DLCD).
