## **CITIZEN INVOLVEMENT ADVISORY COMMITTEE (CIAC) RECOMMENDATIONS TO FILL VACANCIES**

### **I. AGENDA ITEM SUMMARY**

This agenda item is for LCDC to fill one or two vacancies on CIAC.

#### **A. Type of Action and Commission Role**

LCDC is being asked by CIAC to fill two at-large vacancies. The vacancies will fill the positions vacated by Peter Frothingham (whose term ended on June 30, 2008) and Pat Wheeler (who will resign as soon as a replacement is found).

### **II. BACKGROUND**

Frothingham's term ended on June 30, 2008 and he did not wish to be reappointed. Wheeler announced that she would like to leave the committee, but would continue serving until a replacement was found.

On May 9, 2008, DLCD broadly advertised an at-large vacancy on CIAC. The due date for applications was June 6, 2008.

DLCD received applications from John Kilian of Gresham and Don Greene of Ashland.

At the CIAC meeting in June, the committee briefly discussed the applicants. The committee agreed that both were highly qualified. CIAC decided to form a subcommittee to conduct a conference-call interview with each candidate. The subcommittee consisted

of Ian Maitland, Chris White and Jack Johnson. The conference call took place on Thursday, June 26 and included DLCD Director Richard Whitman.

### **III. RECOMMENDATION**

CIAC recommends appointing Mr. Kilian and Mr. Greene to fill the two vacancies.

The Citizen Involvement Advisory Committee (CIAC) is pleased to recommend two applicants for CIAC membership: Don L. Greene and John H. Kilian.

CIAC recruited applicants for an at-large position, vacated by Peter Frothingham; whose term expired in June. Since that recruitment period, another at-large position has become vacant, one that was previously filled by Pat Wheeler.

CIAC recommends appointing two people now, instead of conducting another recruitment for Pat's position. Both applicants have experience and background that would be of benefit to CIAC.

### **Don L. Greene**

Don Greene's experience has been closely associated with land use, but broad in respect to the approaches, e.g. developer, Ashland and Jackson County planning commissioner, State Housing Council member and community services. He helped create a document for citizens interested in testifying before the local planning commission. Don is from Ashland and would add perspective from southern Oregon to the CIAC membership.

### **John H. Kilian**

John Kilian is a private-practice dentist who also has an extensive background of involvement in public policy committees at the state, local and university levels. He is from the Troutdale area and would provide perspective to CIAC related to metro area planning issues. He is well-versed in the issues of Metro Urban and Rural Reserves that would be helpful in CIAC's role in that process.

All CIAC members reviewed the applications, and a subcommittee and Richard Whitman interviewed each of the two applicants by phone.

It is the unanimous recommendation of CIAC that both Mr. Greene and Mr. Kilian be appointed to the two vacant at-large positions. Both applicants could start participating at the next CIAC meeting on August 21, 2008.
