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The Oregon Mortuary and Cemetery Board (Board), after receiving an application for Change of Principal from Hugo Octavio Maese, Jr. (Applicant), found that an arrest and conviction had not been reported.

The Board finds it has grounds to issue a Notice of Proposed Disciplinary Action, upon which Applicant would be provided with the opportunity to request a hearing. In lieu thereof, the parties wish to resolve this matter informally by entering into this Consent Order on the terms set forth below, pursuant to ORS 183.417(3).

The Board and Respondent agree to the following:

1. On December 8, 2014, Board staff received a letter from Applicant stating that he was in the process of clearing up the alleged mistaken identity and that he had failed to disclose this on his application because he believed it had been cleared up in 2008.
2. On or before December 13, 2014, Board staff received notification from Applicant stating that he was in the process of clearing up the alleged mistaken identity. Board staff confirmed with the Texas court that verification was in process.
3. Violations of the Board's rules are cause for disciplinary action under ORS 692.180(1)(g).
4. Respondent acknowledges that he has read, understands, and agrees to the terms of this Consent Order. Respondent agrees to issuance of the Order voluntarily and without any force or duress. Respondent states that the Board and Board staff have not made promises or representations not stated herein to induce Respondent to sign this document and agree to issuance of the Order.
5. Respondent understands that he has the right to a contested case hearing under the Administrative Procedures Act (ORS Chapter 183), and hereby fully and finally waives any and all right to a hearing and any rights to appeal or otherwise challenge this Consent Order.
6. Respondent agrees the Board may issue the Order set forth below.
7. This Consent Order is a public document.
8. This Consent Order shall be effective when signed by the Executive Director of the Board.

ORDER

The Board issues the following final order:

1. Respondent's application is approved under the following conditions:
 - a. If the Texas court determines the incident involved Applicant, the Principal license shall be revoked.
 - b. If it is proven that ID theft occurred, all conditions placed on the approval of Principal license shall be removed.

It is so agreed.
