Mr. Kleiner has worked at Stuntzner Engineering & Forestry since May 2015 and has worked on various small projects such as 2015 Coos Bay North Bend Waterboard Timber Sale, Stinchfield 2016 Timber Sale, 2015 Mahaffy Coos River Timber Sale and the 2015 Bill Harris Timber Sale. Main duties included timber sale layout, timber cruising, sale administration, reforestation and road layout.

Prior to working at Stuntzner Mr. Kleiner's experience included working on an EIS in the Tongass National Forest, Wrangell, AK as well as working as an RPF for Sierra Pacific Industries in Northern California. The Tongass EIS project brought engineering, forestry, biological and archaeological professionals into one project in order to assess the effects of a timber management plan on Wrangell Island in SE Alaska. Working as an RPF in Northern California included writing THP's (Timber Harvest Plans) for Sierra Pacific Industries mainly in Shasta, Trinity, Siskiyou, Modoc and Lassen counties. THP preparation included harvest layout, road design, reforestation, fire suppression, contract administration, sensitive species surveys and biological assessment. THP work heavily involved various state and federal agencies as well as public involvement. Mr. Kleiner is also the supervisor of the Oregon Logging Conference, serving from 2007 to present.

I appreciate the opportunity to participate on the SW Oregon Regional Forest Practices Committee, serving in these types of capacities is of great importance. The Oregon Forest Practices Act is a vital foundation to the success of our Oregon forests.

For the past nineteen years, I have worked as a forester in various capacities. First, as a seasonal forester for Plum Creek Timber in Eastern Washington and, now, as a silviculture forester for Seneca Jones Timber in Roseburg, Oregon. In my early years in forestry, I performed various tasks ranging from harvest layout, check cruising, reforestation audits, to logging sale admin and planting inspection for Plum Creek Timber. Moving back to Oregon in 1999, my career focused more on silviculture. For seven years, my responsibilities consisted of overseeing plantation establishments and maintenance on a 30,000-acre tree farm owned by Swanson Group. In 2007, I began working with Seneca Jones Timber as their Lead Silviculture Forester on their Roseburg Tree Farm. I currently oversee their plantation establishment, maintenance, silviculture staff and budget on their 100,000-acre tree farm, managed out of Roseburg. In my current position, the bulk of my time is spent on project planning and oversight.

Because of my work history I am very familiar with the Oregon Forest Practice rules. In the past, I have been active in the Society of American Foresters and member of the Board of Directors for Forests Today and Forever. The experience I have in the field, plus my dedication towards volunteering within professional organizations, has given me the knowledge and expertise to continue growing as a valuable committee member.
