Hi Kristen and Peter:

As you deliberate on the agenda for the upcoming SHAG meeting of Oct 15, I would like to request that you consider including the issues raised in my August 1 letter to ODF (reattached). Specifically,

\* how will the ODF current process dovetail with the OGWC report that will be in front of the legislature I believe on Oct 16?

\* given the agenda will include discussion of wood product stores, which is not a straight forward issue, can you include the five points referenced on p. 6-7 of my letter, which carries forward from the OGWC report?

\* I remain concerned about the Christensen et al. 2017 shortcomings making their way into the ODF report as discussed on p. 7-19

\* and I concluded with some key literature and data analysis suggestions as to inventory of carbon stocks, fluxes, carbon retention in forests, setting a baseline, social cost of carbon, to name a few. If not now, can you let me know when these topics might be open for discussion and if a response to my letter is forthcoming.
