- You are not able to pass DMV tests to retain or regain your Oregon driving privilege.

To regain a Driver License or Permit once surrendered:

You are required to meet eligibility requirements including, but not limited to:

- Paying for and passing all DMV tests.
- Paying for issuance of the Driver License or Permit.
- When required, submitting a Driver Medical Report completed by your treating health care provider for a Determination of Medical Eligibility by DMV's Medical Determination Officer. Should you regain your driving privileges, you may be required to periodically obtain medical recertification from DMV to retain your privileges.

To qualify for and obtain a free Identification Card:

- Your Oregon Driver License or Permit must still be valid (it cannot be expired).
- Your photo must be less than 9 years old.
- Mail or Fax this form as directed below. You will receive an Identification Card with the picture on your current license valid until the expiration date of your current license or permit.

If you do not meet these qualifications for a free ID but wish to obtain an ID card or surrender a non-REAL ID driver license for a REAL ID Identification card, please visit a DMV office or go to **DMV2U.Oregon.gov** to make an appointment (where available).

ORS 807.400(18): Issuance; application; proof of address; contents; renewal; fee; validity; replacement; cancellation; rules.

Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, the department may issue an identification card to a person under this subsection without charge when the person surrenders the person's driver license or driver permit to the department for reasons described in this subsection. If the department issues an identification card under this subsection, the identification card shall expire at the same time as the surrendered driver license or driver permit would have expired. An identification card issued under this subsection is subject to the same requirements and fees for renewal or upon expiration as any other identification card issued under this section. The department may issue identification cards under this subsection for any of the following reasons:

- (a) The person voluntarily surrenders the person's driver license or driver permit to the department based upon the person's recognition that the person is no longer competent to drive.
- (b) The person's driving privileges are suspended under ORS 809.419 (1). This paragraph only applies if the person voluntarily surrenders the person's driver license or driver permit to the department as provided under ORS 809.500.

ORS 809.500: Failure to return suspended, revoked or canceled license; penalty.

- (1) A person commits the offense of failure to return a suspended, revoked or canceled license if the person has driving privileges suspended and the person fails to immediately return to the Department of Transportation any license or driver permit issued by the department.
- (2) If any person fails to return a license or driver permit on suspension, revocation or cancellation of the person's driving privileges, the department may request any peace officer to secure possession thereof and return it to the department.
- (3) The offense described in this section, failure to return a suspended, revoked or canceled license, is a Class C misdemeanor.

- (9) When the person voluntarily surrenders driving privileges as set forth in OAR 735-062-0135(4), DMV will rescind any suspension imposed prior to the voluntary surrender under sections (2) or (3) of this rule. The person may be eligible for a no-fee identification card.
- (10) DMV may suspend a person's right to apply for driving privileges under section (2) or (3) of this rule and ORS 809.360 if the person has voluntarily surrendered their driving privileges under section (9) of this rule and DMV subsequently receives information indicating the person is operating a motor vehicle without driving privileges and the person has not received a determination of medical eligibility by DMV's Medical Determination Officer.
