ODOT seeks public input on proposed projects

The public will get a chance to comment on ODOT's draft update of its 2014-2015 Statewide Transportation Improvement Program.

The draft, which includes multiple proposed transportation projects in the Portland area, will be the topic of a public meeting from 5 p.m. to 7 p.m. Wednesday, June 29, at ODOT Region 1 Headquarters.

The STIP is Oregon's four-year transportation capital improvement program. It is the document that identifies funding and scheduling for transportation projects and programs. It includes projects for federal, state, city and county transportation systems; multimodal projects – including highway, passenger rail, freight, public transit, bicycle and pedestrian; and projects in national parks and forests.

The public is invited to stop by at any time from 5 p.m. to 7 p.m. ODOT staff will be on hand to discuss project details, take comments and answer general questions. ODOT Region 1 is located at 123 N.W. Flanders St. in Portland and is adjacent to the MAX Red, Blue & Yellow lines. For bus information call (503) 238-RIDE.
