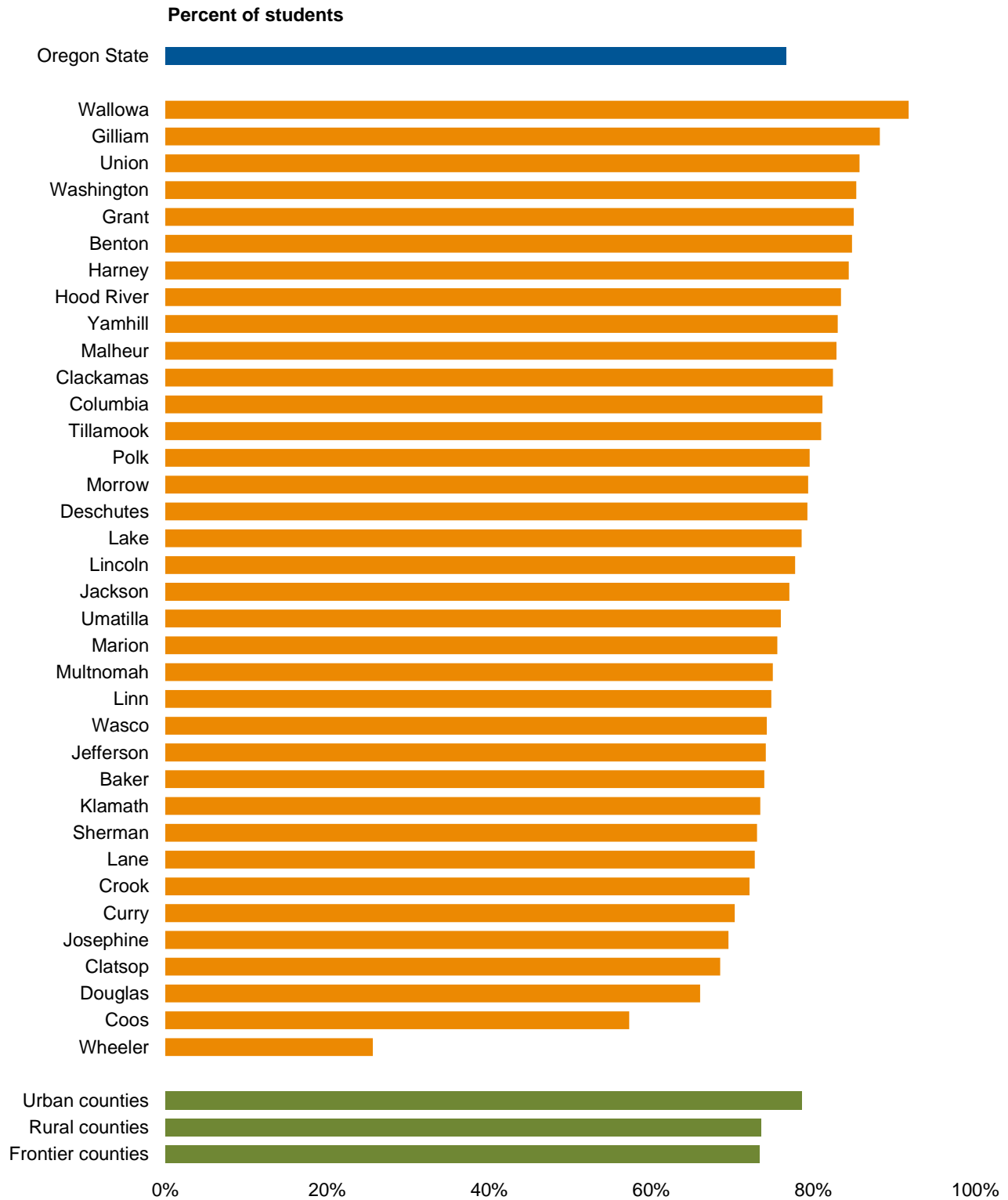


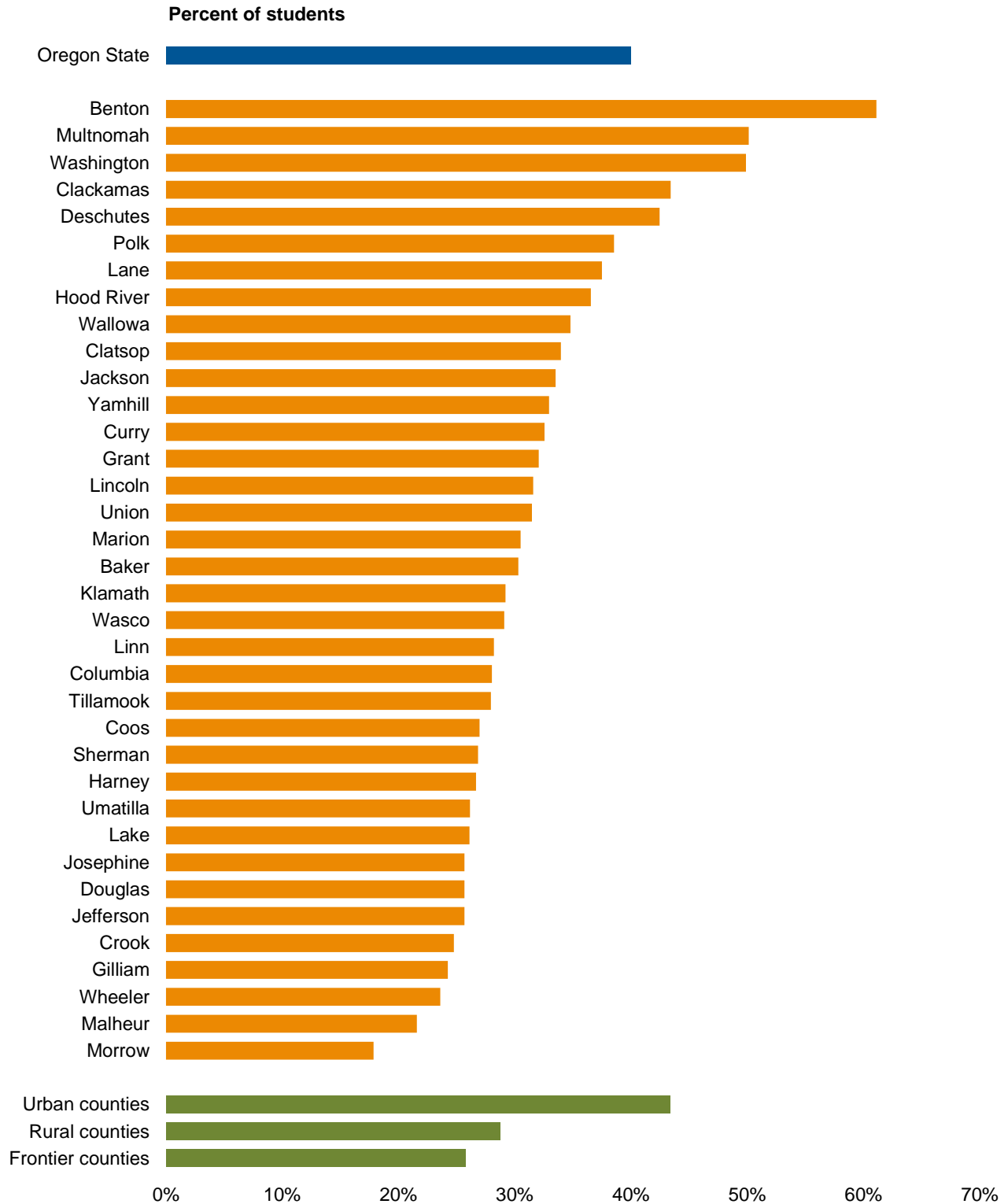

High School Graduation Data Source: Oregon Department of Education

Post-secondary Degree Data Source: American Community Survey (ACS)

Note: The four-year cohort graduation rate represents the percentage of students graduating with a standard diploma within four years. It is calculated by dividing the number students who graduate by the number who enrolled four years earlier in the ninth-grade year (adjusted for transfers in, transfers out, and death).

Note: "Post-secondary" degree includes Associate's, Bachelor's, Master's, Professional and Doctorate degrees.
