**BOARD ACTION REPORT**  
**February 15, 2016**

The information contained in this report summarizes new, interim, and final actions taken by the Oregon Medical Board between January 16, 2016, and February 15, 2016.

These orders are marked with an \* asterisk. **Scanned copies of Consent Agreements are not posted, as they are not disciplinary action and impose no practice limitations.** Complaint and Notices of Proposed Disciplinary Action are not listed in this report, as they are not final actions by the Board. On January 21, 2016, Licensee entered into an Interim Stipulated Order in which he agreed to not accept new ADD or ADHD patients, and to limitations on his prescribing of psycho-active medications pending the completion of the Board's investigation.

**\*Kahn, Heather Alaine, MD; MD22858; Grants Pass, OR**

On January 29, 2016, Licensee entered into an Interim Stipulated Order to voluntarily place restrictions on the prescribing of scheduled controlled substances for chronic pain patients pending the completion of the Board's investigation into her ability to safely and competently practice medicine.

On February 10, 2016, Licensee entered into an Interim Stipulated Order to voluntarily withdraw from performing cataract surgery pending the completion of the Board's investigation into her ability to safely and competently practice medicine.

On February 8, 2016, Licensee entered into an Interim Stipulated Order to voluntarily withdraw from practice and place her license in Inactive status pending the completion of the Board's investigation into her ability to safely and competently practice medicine.

**Williams, Kalaiselvi Balasubramanian, MD; PG175775; Portland, OR**

On January 20, 2016, Licensee entered into a Consent Agreement with the Board. In this Agreement, Licensee agreed to practice under the supervision of pre-approved mentors, to include the submission of reports to the Board by the mentors.

11 This order is issued by the Board pursuant to ORS 677.410, which grants the Board the authority  
12 to attach conditions to the license of Licensee to practice medicine. These conditions will remain in  
13 effect while the Board conducts a complete investigation in order to fully inform itself with respect to the  
14 conduct of Licensee. Pursuant to ORS 677.425, Board investigative materials are confidential and shall  
15 not be subject to public disclosure, nor shall they be admissible as evidence in any judicial proceeding.  
16 However, as a stipulation this Order is a public document and is reportable to the National Databank and  
17 the Federation of State Medical Boards.

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1           3.2     Licensee may continue to treat chronic pain and prescribe methadone for patients  
2 who are currently enrolled in hospice or have a life expectancy of less than six months. Licensee  
3 must certify on the written prescription that the patient is a hospice patient.

4           3.3     Licensee may treat acute or intermittent pain, with short acting opiates for no  
5 more than 60 days per patient in a calendar year and not to exceed 60 morphine equivalent dose  
6 (MED) per day. In addition, Licensee must not combine benzodiazepines with Schedule II or III  
7 medications.

8           3.4     Licensee must immediately begin to taper opioid medications for chronic pain  
9 patients with an MED over 120 as follows:

- 10                   a. For patients taking 400 or less MED, the taper to 120 MED or less must be  
11                    completed within 120 days.
- 12                   b. For patients taking benzodiazepines and opioid MED of 400 or less, the taper  
13                    to 120 MED or less must be completed within 120 days.
- 14                   c. For patients taking more than 400 MED, the taper to 120 MED or less must be  
15                    completed within 180 days.
- 16                   d. For patients taking benzodiazepines and opioid MED more than 400, the taper  
17                    to 120 MED or less must be completed within 270 days.

18           3.5     Within six months of the effective date of this Order, benzodiazepines and muscle  
19 relaxants must be eliminated from the treatment regimen for any patient on opioid therapy for  
20 chronic pain.

21           3.6     For patients on opioid therapy for chronic pain, Licensee may prescribe  
22 benzodiazepines for a single acute event, not to exceed seven days in a calendar year.

23           3.7     Licensee must not direct any other provider to prescribe for chronic pain patients  
24 on her behalf.

25           3.8     Licensee understands that violating any term of this Order will be grounds for  
26 disciplinary action under ORS 677.190(17).

26           3.9     Licensee understands this Order becomes effective the date she signs it.

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At the conclusion of the Board's investigation, the Board will decide whether to close the case or to proceed to some form of disciplinary action. If the Board determines, following that review, not to lift the requirements of this Order, Licensee may request a hearing to contest that decision.
