Senate Bill 126

Senate Bill 126, enacted by Governor Kitzhaber June 1st, goes into effect Jan. 1st, 2012, and allows the Oregon State Board of Examiners for Engineering and Land Surveying (OSBEELS) to regulate the professional conduct of Certified Water Rights Examiners (CWRE) and to discipline violators.

Before Senate Bill 126, neither the Water Resources Department (WRD) nor OSBEELS had any regulatory authority over CWRE certificate holders. The statutes vest OSBEELS with the authority to revoke, suspend, or modify the certificates issued to CWREs. Yet the statutes provided no direction as to when or under what circumstances OSBEELS could take actions. WRD had attempted, by rule (OAR 690-014-0080), to vest OSBEELS with that authority, but it was legally questionable that it could do so. The original provisions related to Water Rights Examiners were enacted by the Oregon State Legislature in 1987. ORS 537.798(4) provides for the disbursement and appropriation of fees collected for the examination and certification of examiners. In 1999, OSBEELS was established as a "semi-independent" Board in accordance with ORS 182.454. The Legislature also



exempted OSBEELS from the general mandate that agency funds must be deposited into the State Treasury and instead provided that the moneys collected or received by OSBEELS must be deposited into an insured depository in accordance with ORS 182.471(1). OSBEELS could not comply with both ORS 537.798(4) and ORS 182.471(1). Since ORS 182.471 was passed after ORS 537.798(4) by implication SB 126 eliminates any issues or questions related to the statutes in conflict.

The WRD relies on documentation by CWREs when it evaluates water right holders' claims for beneficial use. The Water Resources Commission will set the criteria for certification under ORS 537.797; and the WRD will prepare, administer and score the examination.

CWREs are trained surveyors, engineers,

and geologists who have passed exams allowing them to document and confirm the location and beneficial use of water. This documentation is a requirement for any water right holder who submits a "claim of beneficial use," and wishes to get his or her water right "certificated" by the WRD. CWREs in Oregon are professionals who play an important role in the overall water rights process. Occasionally, however, situations arise that require further training or corrective action. SB 126 clarifies authorities to address such situations.

Land surveyors and engineers, who are also licensed, already have requirements to obtain 30 professional development hours (PDH) every two years, 10 of which must be directly related to surveying or engineering. The WRD asked that OSBEELS include the CWREs in the audit of professional development hours (PDH). On July 6th, the OSBEELS staff met with the WRD administration and discussed the future steps required by both agencies. Staff exchanged ideas concerning continuing education requirements and the standards of practice, supervision, and control, offering

to perform services, and modifying documents of another.

While the WRD has historically prepared, proctored and scored the examinations for CWREs, OSBEELS issued the licenses to CWREs and managed the license renewal process. Some portions of the original statute governing CWREs, passed in 1987, were outdated in terms of authorities, fee collection and deposits, and oversight of CWREs.

SB 126 modernizes statutes related to CWRE training (ORS 537.798). Specifically it clarifies the role of the two agencies; OSBEELS and WRD. First, OSBEELS is responsible for issuing water right examiner certificates to individuals who meet certain criteria. The WRD is responsible for preparing, administering, and scoring the related examination. While the board is responsible for setting and collecting fees related to implementation of the certification program, SB 126 notes that the WRD is eligible for reimbursement by the board for its related costs. The WRD will not request reimbursement without a written agreement with OSBEELS and would first allow OSBEELS an opportunity to develop rules to implement this Bill. Further, the Board may adopt rules to regulate CWREs. Such rules are already in place related to the engineering and land surveying professions, and

can include rules that establish standards of professional conduct and rules establishing professional development or continuing education requirements. Further, SB 126 grants OSBEELS the authority to address problems by investigating alleged or suspected violations. This could result in revoking, suspending, or modifying a CWRE license. The bill clarifies existing language and matches the authority in OSBEELS' operational statutes.

Historically, OSBEELS has received no more than 20 applications for an administration period (the CWRE examination is administered once a year in April by WRD). In relation to the number of applications received and reviewed for the engineering and land surveying examinations and the processing of registration renewals, current staff is able to continue accomplishing the review of CWRE applications in addition to processing CWRE certification renewals. There are approximately 450 CWRE certification holders in the State of Oregon required to maintain their professional registration as a Professional Engineer, a Professional Land Surveyor, or a Registered Geologist.

To support this mission and the continued efforts to ensure that only competent and CWREs are providing services, please submit evidence of any CWRE who is not in conformity with accepted Water Rights Examiner's standards. This will allow OSBEELS to investigate the work as it relates to the welfare of the public in safeguarding life, health, and property. ■

The Standards of Land Surveying Practices Committee

As a result of the 2009 Legislative Session Senate Bill (SB) 274 and law enforcement cases brought before the Board, the Standards of Practice for Land Surveying Committee was formed. The intent of codifying standards in rule is to benefit the professional community and to continue the Board's mission to protect the public by making clear guidelines for professional land surveyors.

To facilitate the Committee's efforts, they are researching the standards used by many other states. In several states, the standards are developed and contained in documentation of the professional land surveying associations; not in the laws and rules under the authority of the state boards. Currently, the Committee is determined to focus on one topic at a time beginning with narratives.

The Standards of Practice for Land Surveying Committee presently consists of the following members; Dan Linscheid, Ken Hoffine, Sue Newstetter, Carl Tappert, Bob Neathamer (Emeritus Member), Gary Johnston (Public Member), Chuck Gibbs (Public Member), Jim Hepler (Public Member). Upon completion, the final draft will be presented to the Board for implementation in the Oregon Administrative Rule (OAR) Chapter 820, Division 30. Notices of the Rulemaking Hearing will be published to the Board's Web site and distributed to the interested parties. Senate Bill 157

With the passing of Senate Bill (SB) 55 during the 2005 Legislative Session, the Oregon State Board of Examiners for Engineering and Land Surveying (OSBEELS) was granted authority to regulate the practice of and persons practicing photogrammetric mapping; registered professional photogrammetrists (RPP). However, Oregon Revised Statute (ORS) 672.240 was not revised to allow for a RPP to sit on the Board. As a

result, OSBEELS introduced SB157 during the 2011 Legislative Session, which provides for one member of OSBEELS to be a registered professional photogrammetrist. Effective January 1, 2012, a RPP who meets the other requirements of ORS 672.240 may be appointed. If a qualified individual is not available, SB157 provides that the Governor may appoint either a registered professional engineer or a registered professional land surveyor instead.



Board Administering Photogrammetric Mapping Examination

In February of 2011, OSBEELS and Colonial States Boards for Surveyor Registration (CSBSR) entered into an agreement to which the OSBEELS Board will administer a Photogrammetric Mapping examination developed and owned by CSBSR.

The examination is offered in the Spring administration as required in OAR 820-010-

0440. Persons who wish to be registered as a RPP must submit applications for admission by December 1 for the Spring examination administration. If you have any questions regarding future Photogrammetric Mapping examinations or qualifications, please contact the OSBEELS office.

Professional Testimony Constitutes Practice of Profession

In the past, several retirees have provided expert testimony on the practice of engineering. This constitutes the practice of engineering and those retirees faced civil penalties as a result. The definition of engineering in the Oregon Revised Statutes (ORS) 672.005(1) states:

1) "Practice of engineering" or "practice of professional engineering" means doing any of the following:

- a) Performing any professional service or creative work requiring engineering education, training and experience.
- b) Applying special knowledge of the mathematical, physical and engineering sciences to such professional services or creative work as consultation, investigation, testimony, evaluation, planning, design and services during construction, manufacture or fabrication for the purpose of ensuring compliance with specifications and design, in connection with any public or private utilities, structures, buildings, machines, equipment, processes, works or projects.

This definition explicitly includes the word "testimony." While Retirees can sign a document "PE (Retired)," Retirees are not licensed to practice engineering in Oregon, cannot seal documents, and cannot present themselves as an active professional engineer.

FE, FLS Exams Offered Electronically by 2014

During the August 2010, National Council of Examiners for Engineering and Surveying (NCEES) annual meeting, the state licensing boards voted unanimously to move toward computer based testing (CBT). This decision follows a prolonged study by a special task force, called to research the issue of transitioning to CBT. As a result, by January 2014, the NCEES will administer the (FE) and (FS) examinations electronically for the first time, according to a news report from NCEES.

The examinations will be delivered through Pearson VUE's owned-and-operated network of Pearson Professional Centers as well as other locations determined by NCEES.

Pearson VUE delivers high-stakes tests globally over 165 countries. They specialize in licensure, certification, academic admissions, regulatory, and government testing service markets, including examinations for the National Council of State Boards of Nursing and the National Association of Boards of Pharmacy, as well as the GMAT. Pearson VUE is part of the Pearson plc, the largest commercial testing company and education publisher in the world.

Jerry Carter, Executive Director of NCEES, said that Pearson VUE is taking a collaborative approach through the process so they

can maximize the security and test development.

"There is much work to be done, but we're both committed to an end product that will not only add new layers of security to protect the licensure process and the public it serves, but will also offer greater candidate convenience and provide more uniformity in testing conditions," Carter added.

The transition of examinations to CBT will allow for greater flexibility for examinees, more uniformity in testing conditions, and enhanced security for examinations content.

The timetable for the implementation of CBT begins as the FE and FS content is reviewed allowing the NCEES to develop the examination specifications. The NCEES is also currently reviewing test center locations.

By August 2013, pools of questions will be developed for the initial administration of the examinations in this format. The last time FE and FS examinations will be offered in paper and pen format is October 2013. The PE and PS examinations will continue to be paper-and-pencil examinations. ■



Principles and Practice of Surveying Examination to Become Closed-Book

The National Council of Examiners for Engineering and Surveying (NCEES) delegates approved changes to Examination Development Policies (EDP) to move the Principles and Practice of Surveying examination from an open-book exam to one that allows only a supplied reference.

This change to a closed-book examination begins with the April 2013 administration.

The last open-book examination administration will be October 2012. Delegates approved these changes at the 90th NCEES annual meeting August 24-27, 2011, in Providence, Rhode Island.

According to the NCEES Examination Administration Policies (EAP), closed-book examinations permit only NCEES-supplied reference materials for use in the examination room.

The change intends to ease the future transition into computer based testing. ■





April 2011 Professional Engineering Examination Statistics First Time Takers







October 2011 Professional Engineering Examination Statistics First Time Takers






April 2011 Professional Surveying Examination Statistics
First Time Takers









Investigation and Enforcement Law Enforcement Cases with Sanctions

February 1, 2011 – December 1, 2011

The Oregon State Board of Examiners for Engineering and Land Surveying (OSBEELS) Regulation Department received 61 complaints, closed 55 investigations, and issued disciplinary action in 31 cases during the February 1, 2011 to December 1, 2011, time period. The 55 closed investigations included 40 complaints against engineers and eight complaints against land surveyors. The Board took disciplinary actions against 27 professional engineers and four professional land surveyors. The 31 cases resulted in retirement in seven cases, suspension in eight cases, respondent action in lieu of penalty in two cases, and civil penalties in 25 cases.

2592 – David Place

The Board issued a Final Order against David Place, PE (retired), finding that he stated he was a registered engineer in the State of Oregon during a sworn deposition as part of a civil proceeding. That statement constitutes the practice of engineering. Place was a retired PE at the time of the deposition. Furthermore, Place had an engineering firm listed by the Secretary of State as active to conduct business in Oregon with the title "P.E." Place entered into a settlement agreement to revise his business name to comply with the Board's statutes and rules in lieu of a \$4,000 civil penalty for violating OAR 820-010-0520, OAR 820-010-0720, ORS 672.007(1)(a) and (c), ORS 672.020(1), ORS 672.045(1), and ORS 672.200(4).

2613 – George B. Cathey

The Board issued a Final Order against George B. Cathey finding that he set monuments for a Property Line Adjustment (PLA), but failed to file a map of survey. The investigation found that Cathey sealed and signed survey maps for three alternative configurations to the PLA with certification statements as "a true representation of fact". However, Cathey had not set monuments. Eventually, the county approved a fourth configuration. The client failed to notify Cathey that it was approved so he could prepare a map of survey. Cathey entered into a settlement agreement to pay a \$1,000 civil penalty and to retire his PLS registration and CWRE certification without reinstatement for violating ORS 672.200(4), ORS 672.007(2)(c) and OAR 820-020-0025(1).

2625 – Dennis S. Nelson

The Board issued a Final Order by Default against Dennis S. Nelson, PE, finding that he failed to respond to the Board's audit letters for continuing professional development (CPD), failed to notify the Board of an address change, and failed to notify the Board of disciplinary action taken by another jurisdiction. The investigation found that Nelson was in compliance of an audit of the required professional development hour (PDH) units when he provided supporting documentation for 33 PDH units. However, Nelson resides in the state of Wisconsin, but failed to notify the Board of an address change and a 2007 Wisconsin disciplinary order. Nelson had informed the Board that he had entered into a settlement agreement with Wisconsin, where he agreed to pay a civil penalty and complete an ethics course. In September 2009, the Wisconsin Board issued an additional order suspending Nelson's license as a result of his failure to comply with the terms of the 2007 settlement agreement.

Nelson failed to notify OSBEELS of the September 2009 Wisconsin order. The Board issued a Final Order by Default that assessed him a 90-day suspension and a \$2,000 civil penalty for violation of ORS 672.200(2),(4), OAR 820-010-0605, OAR 820-010-0635(5), OAR 820-020-0015(7),(8), OAR 820-020-0045(4).

2632 – Kelly S. Dame

The Board issued a Default Final Order against Kelly S. Dame, PE, finding that he failed to provide documentation for the PDH units he claimed for the audit period and to maintain records of his professional education activities and to submit that information when requested by the Board. Dame is a Nevada resident. He was assessed a \$1,000 civil penalty and a 90-day suspension for violating OAR 820-010-0645(1),(5), OAR 820-020-0015(7),(8), and ORS 672.200(4).

2635 - Rimvydas I. Gurcinas

The Board issued a Final Order against Rimvydas I. Gurcinas, PE, finding that he failed to cooperate with the Board when requested to participate in a CPD audit. The investigation found that Gurcinas's records were destroyed due to heavy rain that collapsed the roof of his office. He experienced a total loss of his records due to flooding and subsequent mold. He submitted photographic documentation of the damage, but was unable to submit CPD documentation because of the extensive damage. Gurcinas entered into a settlement agreement to waive his suspension and to pay a \$500 civil penalty for violating ORS 672.200(4), OAR 820-010-0635(1),(5), and OAR 820-020-0015(7),(8).

2636- Walter J. Holle

The Board issued a Final Order against Walter J. Holle, PE, finding that he failed to cooperate with the Board during an audit of his CPD activities. The investigation found that Holle submitted a renewal form with the words "inactive status" printed on the signature line, which was not accepted, so Mr. Holle submitted a signed renewal form certifying he had completed the required PDH units. Holle was unable to comply so he entered into a settlement agreement submitting a retirement form with the intention to not return to active status in lieu of the civil penalty and suspension for violating ORS 672.200(2)(4), OAR 820-010-0635(1),(5), OAR 820-015-0026(1), OAR 820-020-0015(7),(8), and OAR 820-020-0025(1).

2638 – Gail N. Luthy

The Board issued a Final Order against Gail N. Luthy, PE finding that she failed to cooperate with the Board when asked to provide documentation of compliance with CPD requirements. Luthy was found to be in compliance after a notice was issued. Luthy entered into a settlement agreement to pay a \$250 civil penalty for failing to cooperate with the Board violating OAR 820-020-0015(8).

2639 – Michael R. Moore

The Board issued a Final Order against Michael R. Moore, PE, finding that he failed to submit CPD documentation in support of his claimed PDH units. The investigation found that Moore submitted the information for review, but it did not total the required 30 PDH units. Moore entered into a settlement agreement to surrender his registration without reinstatement in lieu of the civil penalty for violating ORS 672.200(1), OAR 820-010-0635(1),(5) and OAR 820-020-0015(7).

2641 – Leni J. Seymon

The Board issued a Final Order against Leni J. Seymon, PE, finding that she failed to maintain her PDH records. The investigation found that she placed her registration into exempt status in June 2006. In May 2008, she signed her renewal form certifying she had completed the PDH units that are required to return her registration to active status. When Seymon was randomly requested to participate in the CPD audit, she wrote that she was negligent in not recording her CPD efforts. Seymon entered into a settlement agreement to pay a \$500 civil penalty for violating ORS 672.200(4), OAR 820-010-0635(1),(5), OAR 820-015-0026, OAR 820-020-0015(7).

2642 – James A. Stevenson

The Board issued a Final Order against James A. Stevenson, PE, finding that he failed to maintain his PDH records. The investigation found that Stevenson was able to submit qualified PDH units, but he had not kept the documentation with him after he retired and left unemployment. Stevenson entered into a settlement agreement to pay a \$2,500 civil penalty with no suspension for violating OAR 820-015-0026(1),(2), OAR 820-010-0635(1),(5), and OAR 820-020-0015(7),(8).

2643 – David H. Stitt

The Board issued a Final Order against David H. Stitt, PE (delinquent), finding that he failed to keep and submit proper records and to cooperate with the investigation. The investigation found that Stitt failed to respond to initial audit letters and failed to provide documentation on the required forms and in the proper format. Stitt entered into a settlement agreement to pay a \$1,500 civil penalty for violating OAR 820-010-0635(5), and OAR 820-020-0015(7),(8).

2645 – Steve A. Ward

The Board issued a Final Order against Steve A. Ward, PE, finding that he failed to cooperate with the Board and provide documentation of compliance with CPD requirements. Ward cited extenuating circumstances for not keeping up his records, which was accepted by the Board. Ward entered into a settlement agreement to pay a \$250 civil penalty for violating OAR 820-010-0635(5) and 820-020-0015(7).

2647 – Philip L. Wurst

The Board issued a Final Order against Philip L. Wurst, PE, finding that he failed to provide PDH documentation in compliance with CPD requirements. The investigation found that Wurst submitted a list of PDH units, but failed to provide documentation of his claimed units. When he did reconstruct records to show compliance with CPD requirements, he provided no response for his lack of action. Later, it was found that personal tragedies consumed his time. Wurst entered into a settlement agreement to pay a \$500 civil penalty for violating OAR 820-010-0635(5), OAR 820-020-0015(8), ORS 672.200(4).

2648 – Koichi Yamazaki

The Board issued a Final Order against Koichi Yamazaki, PE, finding that he failed to provide PDH documentation showing compliance with CPD requirements for the audit period. Yamazaki is a resident of Japan. He claimed to have completed the required PDH, but was unable to access his records because he was working out of the country. Yamazaki entered into a settlement agreement to pay a \$250 civil penalty for violating OAR 820-010-0635(1),(5) and OAR 820-020-0015(7).

2657 – Charles M. Redfield

The Board issued a Final Order against Charles M. Redfield, PE (retired), finding that he failed to cooperate with the Board regarding the audit of his CPD activities. When Redfield responded to the Board he stated he had no intention of complying with continuing professional development. Redfield is a California resident. He entered into a settlement agreement to pay \$1,000 civil penalty and to retire his license without reinstatement for violating OAR 820-010-0635(1),(5), OAR 820-020-0015(7),(8), and ORS 672.200(4).

2660 – Gary L. Bisonett

The Board issued a Final Order against Gary Bisonett, PE, finding that he failed to provide documentation of compliance with CPD requirements. Bisonett also failed to maintain records of his professional education activities and submit those records when requested. Bisonett entered into a settlement agreement to pay a \$500 civil penalty and to receive a 90-day suspension for the violation of OAR 820-010-0635(5), OAR 820-020-0015(7), and ORS 672.200(4).

2663 – Larry R. Scoggins

The Board issued a Final Order against Larry R. Scoggins, PE (retired), for failure to provide documentation of compliance with CPD requirements. Scoggins stated his documentation was discarded while moving. Scoggins entered into a settlement agreement to retire his certification without the possibility for reinstatement for violating OAR 820-010-0635(5) and OAR 820-020-0015(7).

2665 – Marc Able

The Board issued a Final Order against Marc Able, PE, finding that he failed to notify the Board of two address changes. However, the case was opened against him for failure to comply with an audit of CPD requirements. Able submitted his CPD documentation during the investigation and it was found to be in compliance. Able entered into a settlement agreement to pay \$100 for violating OAR 820-010-0605(1).

2666 – William F. Boehm

The Board issued a Final Order against William F. Boehm, PE (retired), finding that he failed to cooperate with the Board regarding the audit of his CPD activities, to notify the Board of an address change, and to maintain records of his professional education activities. Boehm entered into a settlement agreement to retire his certification of registration for violating OAR 820-010-0605(1), OAR 820-010-0635(1),(5), OAR 820-020-0015(7),(8), OAR 820-020-0025(1), and ORS 672.200(4).

2667 – John M. Bosch

The Board issued a Final Order against John M. Bosch, PE, finding that he failed to cooperate with the Board regarding the audit of his CPD. Bosch did not respond to three letters from the Board informing him of an audit and failed to provide documentation of compliance with CPD requirements. Bosch's response to the Board stated he had not complied with the audit period. Bosch entered into a settlement agreement to pay \$1,000 civil penalty and to receive a 90-day suspension for violating OAR 820-010-0635(1),(5), OAR 820-020-0015(7),(8), and ORS 672.200(4).

2668 – Jeffrey M. Bruce

The Board issued a Default Final Order against Jeffrey M. Bruce, PE, finding that he failed to provide documentation of compliance with CPD requirements and was untruthful when he signed his renewal form certifying that he had completed the required PDH units. Bruce was assessed a 90-day suspension and a \$3,000 civil penalty for violating ORS 672.200(4), ORS 672.325, and ORS 183.745 for violations of OAR 820-010-0635(1), (5), OAR 820-020-0015(7), OAR 820-020-0025(1), and ORS 672.200(4).

2669 – Stephen F. Burke

The Board issued a Final Order against Stephen F. Burke, PE, finding that he failed to cooperate with the Board when he did not respond to three letters requesting documentation of his CPD. Burke eventually submitted the required CPD documentation and was found to be in compliance. Burke entered into a settlement agreement to pay a \$250 civil penalty for failing to cooperate with the Board violating 820-020-0015(8) and ORS 672.200(4).

2671 – Britton W. Gentry

The Board issued a Final Order against Britton W. Gentry, PE, finding that he failed to respond to Board requests during an audit of his CPD requirements. When Gentry provided the documentation he was found in compliance, however, he failed to provide documentation of his PDH activities for a period of approximately six months. Gentry entered into a settlement agreement to pay \$250 for violating OAR 820-010-0635(5) and OAR 820-020-0015(8).

Social Security Guidelines

As part of your application for an initial or renewed occupational, professional or recreational license, certification, or registration issued by OSBEELS, you are required to provide your Social Security Number to OSBEELS. This is mandatory. The authority for this requirement is ORS 25.785, ORS 305.385, 42 USC § 405 (c) (2) (C) (I), and 42 ISB § 666 (a) (13). Failure to provide your Social Security Number will be a basis to refuse to issue or renew the license, certification, or registration you seek. This record of your Social Security Number will be used for child support enforcement and tax administration purposes (including identification) only, unless you authorize other uses of the number. Although a number other than your Social Security Number appears on the face of the licenses, certificates, or registrations issued by OSBEELS, your Social Security Number will remain on file with OSBEELS.

If, the United States Social Security Administration has not issued you a social security number, you must follow these guidelines:

- a. form must be signed by you;
- b. You are attesting to the fact that no social security number has been issued to you by the United States Social Security Administration; and
- c. are acknowledging that knowingly supplying false information under this section is a Class A misdemeanor, punishable by imprisonment of up to one year and a fine of up to \$6,250.

2672 – Darren S. Harr

The Board issued a Final Order against Darren S. Harr, PLS, finding that he failed to cooperate with the Board regarding the audit of his CPD activities and to comply with continuing professional development requirements. Harr also failed to maintain his records of professional education activities. Harr entered into a settlement agreement to pay a \$1,100 civil penalty and serve a 30-day suspension for violating OAR 820-010-0605, OAR 820-010-0635(1),(5), OAR 820-020-0015(7),(8), and ORS 672.200(4).

2674 – Richard A. Kellner

The Board issued a Final Order against Richard A. Kellner, PE (delinquent), finding that he failed to provide documentation of CPD units. Kellner initially failed to provide any supporting documentation of the PDH units claimed for the audit period, but was able to document compliance. Kellner entered into a settlement agreement to pay a \$250 civil penalty for failing to cooperate with the Board in violation of OAR 820-020-0015(8).

2675 – Frank Lee

The Board issued a Final Order against Frank Lee, PE (retired), finding that he failed to cooperate with the Board regarding the audit of his CPD activities. Lee failed to respond to letters from the Board informing him of an audit, as well as failing to provide documentation of PDH units or to maintain records of his professional education activities. Lee entered into a settlement agreement to pay \$500 civil penalty and to retire his license without the possibility for reinstatement in violation of OAR 820-010-0635(1),(5), OAR 820-020-0015(7),(8), and ORS 672.200(4).

2679 – Paul C. Anderson

The Board issued a Final Order against Paul C. Anderson, PE, finding that he failed to cooperate with the Board regarding the audit and investigation and to provide documentation of his CPD activities. Anderson provided documentation of his CPD activities after the Board issued a notice. Anderson entered into a settlement agreement to pay a \$250 civil penalty for failing to cooperate with the Board violating OAR 820-020-0015(8).

2680 – Paul H. Durand

The Board issued a Final Order against Paul Durand, PE (retired), finding that he failed to provide documentation of compliance with continuing professional development requirements and to cooperate with the audit. The Board also found that Durand had been disciplined by the California Board. According to OAR 820-020-0045(4), Durand is required to provide notification "immediately upon receiving notice of the action or sanction." However, Durand failed to notify OSBEELS of this action. Durand entered into a settlement agreement to pay a \$500 civil penalty and to retire his certification without the possibility for reinstatement for violating OAR 820-020-0045(4) and ORS 672.200(4).

2682 – Paul E. Green

The Board issued a Default Final Order against Paul E. Green, PE, finding that he failed to provide and to maintain documentation that he complied with the required PDH units. He was also found to be untruthful when he signed his renewal form certifying he had completed the required PDH units for renewal of his registration. Green was assessed a 90-day suspension and a \$3,000 civil penalty for violations of OAR 820-010-0635(1),(5), OAR 820-020-0015(7), OAR 820-020-0025(1), and ORS 672.200(4).

2683 – Fredrick M. Hotes

The Board issued a Final Order against Fredrick M. Hotes, PLS (retired), finding that he failed to cooperate with the Board regarding the audit of his CPD activities. Hotes stated he was unable to locate any of his documentation. As a result, Hotes failed to obtain the required PDH units for the audit period claimed as a condition of his renewal. He also failed to maintain his CPD records. Hotes entered into a settlement agreement to pay a \$500 civil penalty and to retire his certification without reinstatement for violating OAR 820-010-0635(1),(5), OAR 820-020-0014(7),(8), OAR 820-020-0025(1), and ORS 672.200(4).

2686 - Vince A. Roberts

The Board issued a Default Final Order against Vince A. Roberts, PE, finding that he failed to provide documentation of compliance with CPD requirements. Roberts also failed to maintain records of his professional education activities and submit those records when requested. Roberts was assessed a \$1,000 civil penalty for the violation of OAR 820-010-0635(5), OAR 820-020-0015(7), and ORS 672.200(4).


Social Security Number on Renewal Forms
