Room 1: Legal and Carceral Settings

Challenge Statement: Youth in the carceral/JJ system need/want better services and resources for substance use treatment inside the carceral setting and in their transition out because currently the services provided don't adequately support and provide resources to those needing treatment or being required to legally to prevent reincarceration

Challenge Statement: Individuals of all ages (including youth up to age 25) in all carceral settings need immediate access to a full continuum of co-occurring behavioral healthcare because the majority of incarcerated persons are struggling with untreated Mental Health and Substance Use Disorders which lead to the commission of their crimes and it is necessary to help prepare them to return to the community with skills and ability to succeed.]

- After release you there not sober living spaces so you are going back to the environment that sent you to the system
- Mental health issues and trauma are underlying
- Once in the system needs are not met
- No immediate support and have to ask for support which is not given until they are in trouble again
