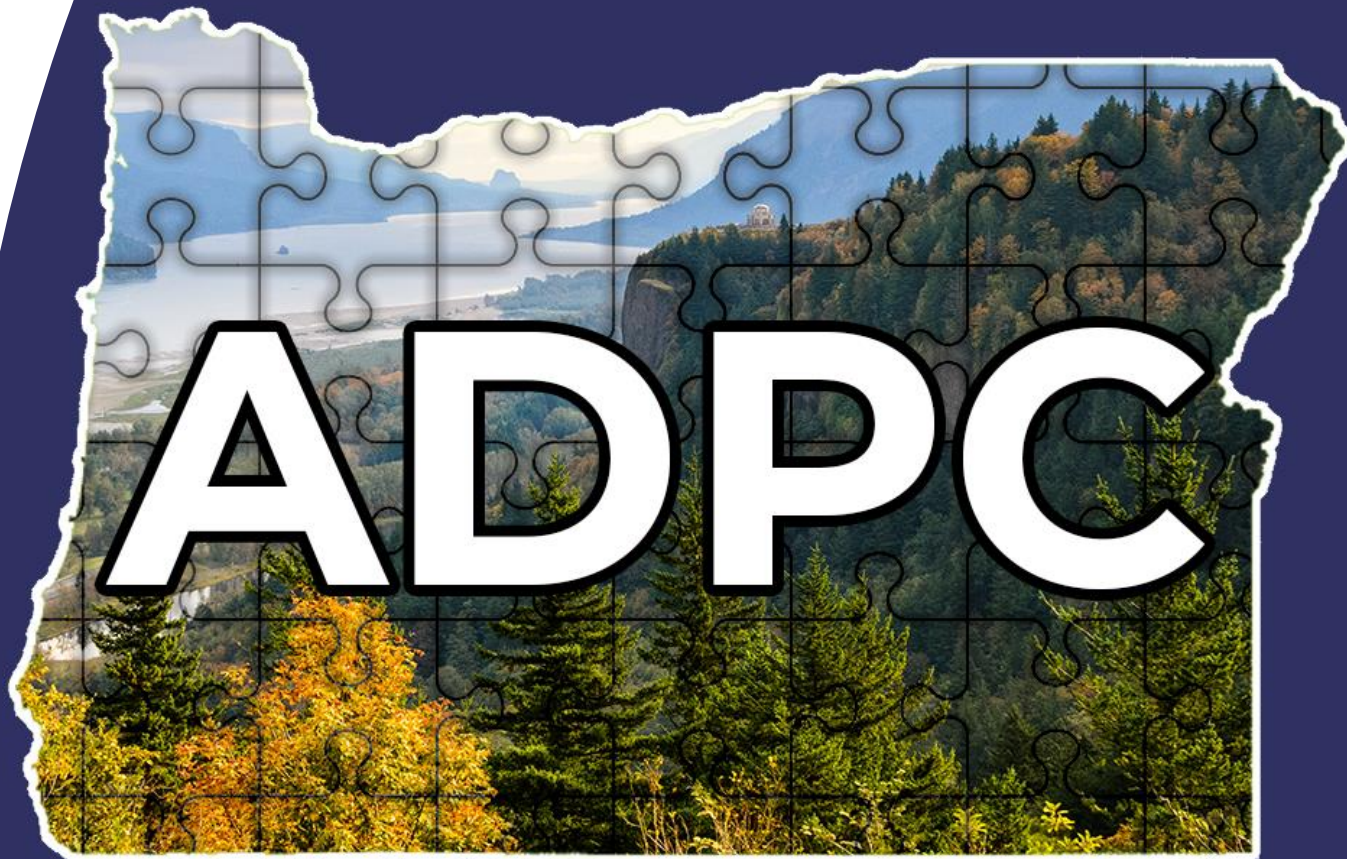

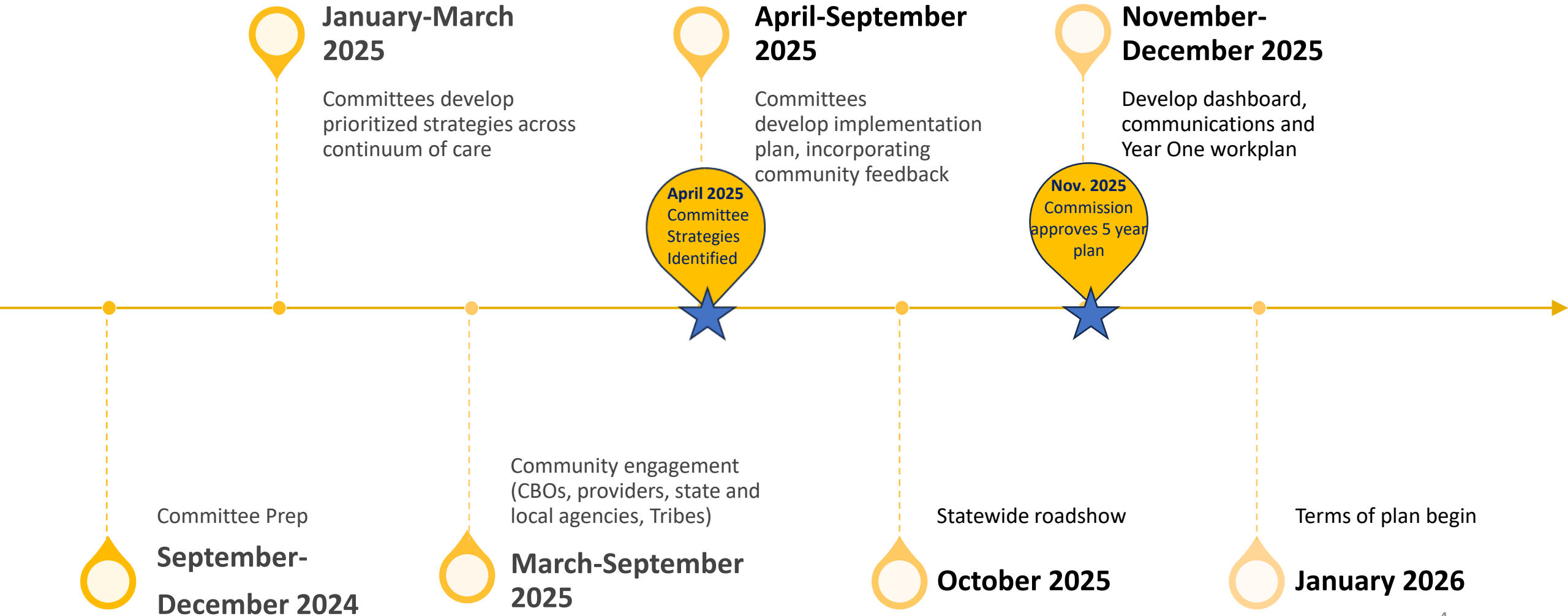
Director's Update

Impact 1 SUD-related SAMHSA Measures

Decrease the share of Oregonians with a SUD	21.90%
Increase share of Oregonians in Recovery	
Decrease past 30-day drug use (excl marijuana)	31.22%
Decrease past 30-day illegal drug use (incl marijuana)	24.03%
Decrease past-year methamphetamine use	1.20%
Share of those needing treatment that did not receive	79.10%

- Inform Strategy
 - Validate progress
 - Identify opportunities to pivot

 - Budgetary/Fiscal
 - Regulatory
- Ensure Accountability
 - Across State Agencies
 - Across Industry
- Inform Constituencies
 - Industry
 - Policymakers
 - Community

Outcomes Approach

- Theme + “Big Three”
 - Overarching Theme: Improving Access
 - Reduction in Prevalence of SUD
 - Reduction in SUD-related deaths
 - Reduction in SUD-related disparities and inequities
- Time Bound
 - Near Term (1-2 years of the plan execution)
 - Mid Term (3-5 years of the plan execution)
 - Long Term (5-10 years, central in next plan)
- Utilize proxy/intermediate data to indicate progress over time
