## **2.25.25 ADPC PREVENTION SUBCOMMITTEE RECAP NOTES:**

**Members Present:** Caroline Cruz, Debby Jones, Pam Pearce, Lyndi Petty, Shauna Tominey, Alexis Drakatos, Zebuli Payne, Ami Muilenburg, Luis Pimentel, Beth Stormshak, Darin Dale, Martin Lockett

### **1) Welcome**

- The chair opened the meeting and noted it is part of a year-long series of conversations on prevention and the center of excellence.
- Prevention work uses the Committee's **definition of primary/universal prevention** (NAM/IOM) and ties into statewide strategies.
- Public comment would be taken near the end; written comments can also be sent by email for the record.

### **2) Director & Legislative Updates**

- Director Dolph updated the committee on the SUD Continuum of Care Financial Analysis and the HB 3321 analysis specific to prevention. ADPC is partnering with agencies to support collecting information on the 2023-2025 biennium.
- Legislative Session continues, but several of the prevention related bills have stalled or are not moving forward.

### **3) Vote on Charter & Co-Chair Nominee**

- The agenda scheduled a **vote on charter updates** and a **co-chair nominee**. (January notes show staff had been drafting language to add a non-Commissioner co-chair and an attendance policy.)
- The group held a vote on charter revisions to institute a co-chair position and update attendance provisions.
  - Pam Pearce moved to adopt the new language, Caroline Cruz seconded. The vote was unanimously in favor of adopting the new language.
- Luis Pimentel was nominated to serve in the newly created co-chair position and the group held a confirmation vote.
  - Caroline Cruz moved to confirm Luis, and Pam Pearce seconded. The vote was unanimously in favor of Luis Pimentel serving as the committee's new Co-Chair.

### **4) Center of Excellence (CoE) — Report & Discussion (11:00–11:45)**

- The Committee discussed the **Prevention Center of Excellence** concept, supported by Third Horizon Strategies (landscape scan in Oregon and nationally). This work aligns with the Comprehensive Plan and with the **HB 3321** assessment that examines funding and system gaps.
- Key questions raised (from January carry-over and reiterated here):
  - How to balance **primary, secondary, and tertiary prevention** within the CoE's scope? How does the CoE's scope connect to other parts of the continuum of care?
  - How to **learn from Oregon Tribes' approaches**, including possible **1115 waiver** avenues and Tribal-Based Practice recognition?
  - What governance and coordination are needed for **singular leadership** and strong statewide alignment?
- Staff noted this is “**conversation #1 of a year of conversations**” to build the CoE model and related prevention actions.
