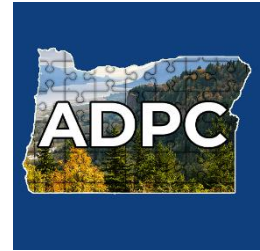

Welcome and Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 10:32 AM. Roll call was conducted, and quorum was established.

Director's Updates

Presented by Director Dolph

Level Setting on CoE Planning

Presented by Wes Rivers

Wes Rivers led a discussion on the development of the Prevention Center of Excellence (COE), which, along with HB 3321 implementation, will be the committee's primary focus for the year. The COE is intended to expand the use of best practices, provide technical assistance, and strengthen Oregon's primary prevention workforce.

Review of the goals the committee adopted last year, including:

- Establishing a statewide Center of Excellence to support best practices.
- Providing technical assistance and evaluation support.
- Strengthen Oregon's primary prevention workforce.
- Develop a clear scope of work and governance structure.
- Build toward a fully operational statewide prevention hub by 2028.

Workforce Considerations

- HB 3321 will help identify funding gaps and opportunities to better support current staff across agencies, counties, and community partners.
- The COE is expected to serve the existing workforce first, then expand to adjacent fields such as education and early childhood services.
- Local partners highlighted that prevention work is already happening across counties, but capacity is limited; a COE could strengthen and connect these efforts.

Discussion on Scope

Presented by Chair Jones

Members discussed what the COE should include and how it should support Oregon's prevention system. There was a focus on the importance of designing the COE carefully to avoid confusion or duplication. Several members shared examples from past prevention infrastructure and encouraged a model that supports frontline workers. The group agreed to focus on building a strong foundation before discussing funding.

Key Points:

- Workforce support is a major priority.
- COE expected to serve current workforce first, then expand.
- Need for alignment across agencies, counties, and related fields.
- Concerns about clarity, effectiveness, and avoiding duplication.
- Past Prevention Resource Center offers useful lessons.
- Support for a hub-and-spoke model for frontline access.
- Agreement to focus on design before funding.
