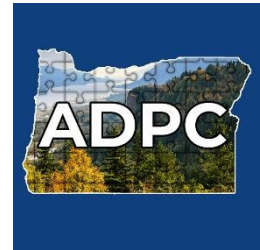

- Youth leaders shared early recommendations for how recovery centers can better serve young people. Their feedback includes the need for transportation, clear age-range guidelines, trauma-informed staff training, and smooth transitions between youth and adult services.

## **Expired Naloxone: National Context**

**Presented by Dr. Strader, The Naloxone Project**

**Background:** Regulatory and legal framework in states for delivering expired naloxone. The presentation covered expired naloxone legislations, why it is crucial in reducing overdose deaths, and how your state can implement it in the next legislative cycle.

Questions were raised about national guidance, supply chain issues, and how these patterns developed. The group plans to continue gathering information to better understand the national landscape.

## **Naloxone: Barriers and Solutions**

**Presented by Chair Andoniadis and Mara Sargent**

Members identified several challenges related to naloxone, including:

- receiving doses near their expiration date,
- uncertainty about rules for expired naloxone, and
- uneven distribution patterns that make planning difficult.

Members suggested the need for clearer information and better understanding of how to prevent waste and improve access.

## **Expired Naloxone: Oregon Context**

**Presented by Chair**

Oregon continues to experience similar concerns with expired naloxone. Some groups are receiving shipments that expire too quickly to distribute effectively. Members noted the

importance of understanding root causes and improving education efforts for both partners and the public about what is allowed and safe.
