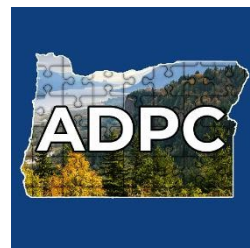

SUBCOMMITTEE RECAP NOTES:

Organizational Business

The meeting was called to order at 9:33 AM. Roll call was conducted and quorum was established.

Director's Updates

Presented by Director Dolph

Alcohol and Drug Policy Commission

- The Commission met in June at the Miracles Club to continue conversations about frameworks for measurement, using existing frameworks like recovery capitals, social determinants of health, and positive youth development.
- We will be sharing Q2 updates at our July meeting.

Next meeting: July 13, 2026

Recovery Committee Update

- Recovery is still discussing Recovery Community Center definitions and has been collaborating with Oregon Youth Addiction Alliance on best practices for youth.

Next meeting: July 16, 2026

Treatment Committee Update

- Currently designing provider landscape assessment to identify measurable baselines for various aspects of the treatment work plan. The goal is to be able to measure impact by redistributing the survey next year.

Next meeting: July 8, 2026

Prevention Committee Update

- Currently developing recommendations for the scope of a primary Center of Excellence in Oregon.

Next meeting: July 22, 2026

Local Opioid Settlement Board

- The Local Opioid Settlement Board is mapping approved settlement funding uses to the Comprehensive Plan strategies. A request for grant applications is expected to be available to the public in the fall, with approximately \$13.5M in one-time funds.

Six Month Comprehensive Plan Update

Presented by Mara Sargent

Mara Sargent provided a progress update on the statewide naloxone strategy. The financial analysis underlying the strategy is currently under review, with a draft planned for submission to the Governor's Office in **July 2026**. After incorporating feedback, the final report will be released publicly. Both **ODHS** and **OLCC** have expressed interest in exploring policies that would support expanded naloxone distribution. Mara will continue collaborating with state agencies to advance naloxone access efforts. Committee members may offer guidance or input as needed.

Progress Highlights

Activity 1: Expand MMCAP Utilization

- State agencies (ODHS, OLCC) show increased interest in naloxone purchasing and distribution policy.
- Financial analysis of naloxone spending is nearly complete and expected to be shared publicly in September; draft to be submitted to the Governor's office in July.
- MMCAP provided data on expenditure patterns, including breakdowns by account type and Safe Lives Oregon's contributions.
- Rural Health Transformation Project is conducting naloxone-related work and may present updates to the committee.

Activity 2: Expand Distribution Channels + Create a Naloxone Toolkit

- Committee will begin building a **statewide naloxone guidance toolkit** next month.
- Safe Lives Oregon will present their participant survey data in August.
- Toolkit components under consideration include:
 - Model policies (including on expired naloxone)
 - Standardized guidance and educational resources
 - Clear instructions on naloxone access channels
 - Potential annual updates to address emerging needs (e.g., training, product types)

Activity 3: Reduce Barriers & Expand Outreach

- Significant committee focus on **expired naloxone**:
 - Meetings scheduled with Oregon State Police and Board of Pharmacy to clarify rules and develop model policies.
 - Anticipated legislation regarding expired naloxone and Good Samaritan coverage is forthcoming.

- Additional barriers identified: uneven distribution, unclear expiration rules, and lack of consistent statewide messaging.

Future Focus Areas

Several committee members voiced priority issues:

- Need for clearer public and responder level education on naloxone administration (e.g., dosage timing, rescue breathing) and differences between nasal spray and injectable formulations.
- Education tailored for:
 - rural communities,
 - EMS and fire agencies,
 - community members,
 - pharmacists and other professionals.
- Concerns about upcoming legislation affecting syringe service programs (e.g., proposed 1,000-foot school buffer). Senator Reynolds will attend the August meeting to gather committee feedback.
