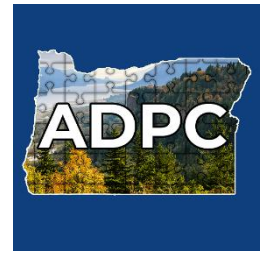

Presented by Director Dolph

MEMBERSHIP UPDATES & CHAIR UPDATE

Recognition of Outgoing Commissioner Frankie Hupy

Commissioner Frankie Hupy was honored for eight years of distinguished service. Commissioners and staff reflected on their contributions, noting their unique perspective and consistent engagement. They shared closing remarks expressing confidence in the direction of the strategic plan and appreciation for the Commission's progress.

Chair Transition

Commissioner Chair Vezina, serving in his final meeting as Chair, commented on Commission advancements during his tenure.

Commissioner/Incoming Chair Minty announced that her term as a Klamath County commissioner will end in December 2026. Commissioner Minty will continue to serve as an ADPC Commissioner through 2026, but withdrew from the ADPC Chair position.

ACTION ITEM:

MOTION: A motion was made and seconded to recommend Commissioner Debbie Jones to the Governor for appointment as ADPC Chair.

Election for New ADPC Chair

Commissioner Jones accepted nomination to serve as Chair. The motion carried unanimously.

Commissioner Transition

Commissioner Cruz announced her appointment as Chief Operations Officer for Confederated Tribes of the Warm Springs and will complete her ADPC term in September. She intends to recommend a qualified successor.

AD HOC DATA WORKGROUP

Presented by Director Dolph

ADPC Staff presented a proposal to establish an Ad Hoc Data Workgroup to align ADPC data activities with three major statewide initiatives:

- Opioid Settlement Data Workgroup;
- OHA's Health Data Warehouse development;
- Internal OHA substance use disorder data integration.

The Workgroup would enhance cross agency coordination, support measurement of strategic plan outcomes, and streamline data governance. Commissioners expressed support of the Workgroup, and it will move forward.

FOLLOW-UP: COMPREHENSIVE PLAN OUTCOMES & MEASURES

Presented by ADPC Staff

ADPC Staff delivered a detailed briefing on measurement considerations within the Commission's strategic work:

Substance Use Prevalence Data

- NSDUH methodology changes in 2020 increased estimated prevalence from approximately 10% to 21.6%, limiting comparability across years.
- Commissioners expressed concerns about sampling limitations affecting representation of marginalized populations.
- Staff commented on a Mult indicator approach incorporating overdose data, treatment utilization, and hospitalization trends.

Recovery Capital Framework

Can be used to assess Recovery Centers' effectiveness in promoting participant well-being, peer support engagement, and community integration.

Positive Youth Development (PYD) Framework

Applied to the School Based Screening and Intervention Pilot to evaluate:

- Attendance and disciplinary outcomes;
- Student adult connectedness;
- Educational achievement;
- Treatment and recovery supports.

Commissioners discussed alignment with upstream prevention strategies and transitions from youth to adult services.

COMMITTEE UPDATES

Presented by Committee Chairs

Health and Safety Interventions:

- Continuing conversations around Naloxone / expired Naloxone in the Oregon and National context
- Upcoming meeting: Save Lives Oregon will share out survey results
- **Next committee meeting: June 30, 2026**

Treatment:

- Continuing to align with the Comprehensive Plan's treatment priorities
- Provider assessment: questions related to capacity, withdrawal management, and data metrics
- **Next committee meeting: June 10, 2026**

Recovery:

- Currently implementing youth consideration on Revery Community Center definition
- Reviewing recovery metrics
- **Next committee meeting: June 18, 2026**

OYAA:

- Six-month update on school pilots, OYAA's work with DHS, and the Recovery Community Center definition
- Two new members appointed, one youth member and one family member
- **Next committee meeting: June 10, 2026**

Prevention:

- Work continues towards building a beginning framework for what is necessary for a Center of Excellence.
- HB3321 – Surveys are currently being shared to determine primary prevention strategies and to review financial sources.
 - **Next committee meeting: June 24, 2026**

PUBLIC COMMENT AND CLOSING

Presented by Chair Vezina

A member of the public provided remarks emphasizing gaps in substance use disorder services for youth disconnected from school systems. They expressed interest in coordinated work with ADPC and the Opiate Settlement Workgroup to address unmet needs in residential and high acuity youth settings. Commissioners acknowledged the concerns and potential collaboration.
