ORGANIZATIONAL BUSINESS

The meeting came to order at 1:05 PM. Roll call was conducted and quorum established.

DIRECTOR UPDATES & NEW MEMBER INTRODUCTION

Presented by Director Dolph

- 2023–2025 Financial Analysis is nearing completion, with the draft scheduled for submission to the Governor in July 2026 and the final report planned for September 2026.
- HB 3321 Primary Prevention Financial Assessment is progressing as planned and remains on track for Q3 2026, led by the Prevention Committee and Third Horizon.
- Work continues to map Oregon's major behavioral health funding streams including Measure 110, Measure 91, CJC, and Opioid Settlement resources - to align allocations with the Comprehensive Plan.
- The Opioid Settlement Board is preparing its 2026 RFGA, expected to support non-Medicaid services across the continuum.
- Commission staffing continues to build toward full capacity, strengthening ADPC's ability to provide cross-agency recommendations and guidance.
- The ADPC Ad Hoc SUD Data Workgroup has launched to improve cross-agency data sharing and support the new annual All-Payor All-Claims SUD analysis.

New Member Introduction:

Stephanie Damon-Moore was welcomed as the newest member of the Commission. She introduced herself as a public defender in Portland, a role she has held for seven years, and noted that she also supervises case managers who connect clients with treatment services. She briefly highlighted her experience supporting clients through recovery and treatment processes.

COMPREHENSIVE PLAN 2026 Q2 UPDATE

Presented by ADPC Staff & Committee Chairs

Infrastructure

- State spending across the SUD continuum is being reviewed using the 2021–23 Financial Analysis as baseline; updated findings will be released in fall 2026.
 - Cannabis and opioid settlement funds identified as priority flexible funding sources for services not covered by Medicaid (primary prevention, recovery, harm reduction).
 - Mapping of key statewide funding (M110, M91, CJC, opioid settlement) continues.
 - Annual All-Payor All-Claims SUD analysis is now under contract; internal workgroups are strengthening data coordination statewide.
 - Efforts underway to align statutory definitions and procurement practices to improve culturally specific responsiveness in service delivery.
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2026 Q2 Prevention Implementation Report

- **HB 3321 Primary Prevention Assessment** has entered the **local assessment phase**, marking a major milestone for statewide primary prevention infrastructure development.
- The **Center of Excellence** scope is nearly complete, built around six pillars supporting statewide consistency in prevention practice, workforce development, rapid response, coordination, translation of evidence, and integration of risk/protective factors.

- ODE has established a **formal advisory committee**, with ADPC and OHA providing staffing and guidance.
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2026 Q2 Oregon Youth Addiction Alliance (OYAA) Implementation Report

- **Eight school districts** are implementing early-intervention pilot programs focused on screening, treatment access, and recovery support; evaluation is being contracted.
 - A scaled pilot is being developed to integrate SUD services into Intensive In-Home Behavioral Health Treatment following statewide budget cuts.
 - DOJ is reviewing a formal agreement between OHSU's Adolescent Co-Occurring Specialty Clinic and ODHS to support case consultation, tele-assessment/therapy, and MOUD access.
 - Youth-focused recommendations for Recovery Community Centers (RCCs) prepared and shared with the Recovery Committee.
 - Gender-affirming curriculum has been purchased; ASAM 4 youth guidance is being developed for August training and adoption.
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2026 Q2 Recovery Committee Implementation Report

Recovery

- **Recovery Community Center (RCC) Definition finalized**, outlining required features: non-residential, peer-operated, staffed with a director, providing drop-in access, peer support, and recovery-capital-building services.
 - Youth feedback shaped a supplemental youth RCC framework addressing structure, boundaries, safety, transportation, cultural supports, and age-appropriate access.
 - The Recovery Committee is evaluating **BARC-10** as a statewide recovery capital measurement tool.
 - Ongoing work includes recovery housing level-of-care exploration, peer services alignment, and center-level reporting standards.
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Q2 Treatment Implementation Update

- The **Evidence-Based Practice (EBP) Workgroup** launched in May and is drafting statewide guidance documents and technical assistance recommendations.
 - The **MSUD Workgroup** began in June, working to advance medication access strategies and coordination with the Opioid Response Network.
 - A statewide **Provider Landscape Assessment** is under development for **fall 2026** administration, with a follow-up planned for 2029 to measure progress.
 - Internal collaboration with BHD-SUD is underway to address waitlist and access requirements in residential and population-specific programs.
 - ASAM 4 implementation efforts continue, aligned with withdrawal management and residential treatment improvements.
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Q2 Health & Safety Interventions Implementation Update

- **OLCC hemp registry** rules enforcement initiated.
- Work underway with agencies to clarify **expired naloxone rules**.
- ODHS and OLCC exploring naloxone policies to improve distribution.

- Naloxone will receive its own financial category for biennium funding review.
 - Review of MMCAP naloxone purchasing data continues.
 - Rural Health Transportation Program continues naloxone-related efforts.
 - Save Lives Oregon will present survey findings on naloxone access points.
 - APDC naloxone toolkit in development.
 - Clarification of rules around possession/distribution of expired naloxone ongoing; potential legislation may address Good Samaritan protections.
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Action Items

- Submit draft **Financial Analysis** to the Governor (July), finalize report (September).
- Advance **HB 3321** assessment through local evaluation and prepare recommendations.
- Complete mapping of statewide substance-related funding sources.
- Continue full staffing and cross-agency coordination efforts.
- Implement annual **All-Payor All-Claims SUD analysis** via newly executed contract.
- Finalize **Center of Excellence** scope and move into governance planning.
- Roll forward evaluation and implementation of all **eight OYAA school pilots**.
- Finalize OHSU–ODHS agreement for youth rapid access and tele-supports.
- Solidify youth RCC standards for Commission alignment.
- Complete Provider Landscape Assessment development for **Fall 2026** launch.
- Continue statewide naloxone strategy work, including toolkit development and clarification of expired-naloxone policy.
