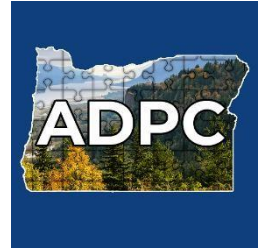

### ADPC

## **HB 3321 Assessment Update**

**Presented by Third Horizon Strategies**

**Background:** Third Horizon is leading the statewide prevention inventory, financial review, and workforce analysis required under HB 3321. Committee members have been requested to share surveys.

Several surveys are being conducted, including:

- A statewide K-12 school survey
- A college prevention survey
- A provider survey

**Timeline:** early findings in June, draft report in August, and final report to the Legislature in September.

## **Scoping for CoE Continued**

**Presented by Chair Jones**

### **Primary Focus of the CoE**

- The Center of Excellence (CoE) should begin by supporting Oregon's existing primary prevention workforce.
- After establishing this foundation, the CoE can expand its support to additional partners and sectors over time.
- Coordination across systems is essential to avoid siloed work and to ensure efficient use of limited resources.
- Creating clear access points for rural communities so they can easily receive support and information.

### **Recommended Additions to the CoE's Initial Audience**

Members suggested including the following groups in early CoE outreach and support:

- Traditional health workers
- Home-visiting nurses and family support staff
- Community health workers (CHWs)
- Culturally specific organizations
- Juvenile justice partners
- Parent education providers
- Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs) and rural service organizations
