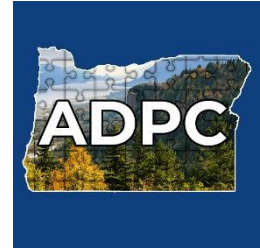

## Welcome and Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 10:30AM. Roll call was conducted, and quorum was established.

## Director's Updates

Presented by Director Dolph

### Alcohol and Drug Policy Commission

- The Commission held an exercise to align work with the recovery-oriented system of care framework, exploring how individual-level efforts connect to statewide outcomes. Additional guidelines for agencies and programs will be developed.

- The Recovery Committee also held an exercise to align work with the recovery-oriented system of care framework, exploring how individual-level efforts connect to statewide outcomes. Additionally, the Recovery Committee has voted on a definition of Recovery Community Centers.

- Treatment Committee continues to work on a statewide school provider survey in partnership with Third Horizon.

### **Oregon Youth Addiction Alliance**

- Youth leaders shared early recommendations for how recovery centers can better serve young people. Their feedback includes the need for transportation, clear age-range guidelines, trauma-informed staff training, and smooth transitions between youth and adult services.

## **ODE Prevention Advisory Nomination**

**Presented by Wes Rivers**

The Committee received an update regarding the nomination process for representation on the Oregon Department of Education (ODE) Prevention Advisory Committee. The Chairs conducted a review of qualified candidates and completed their selection.

The Chairs have elected two nominees. Committee members Alexis Drakatos and Dr. Beth Stormshak will both represent ADPC Prevention Committee on the ODE Prevention Advisory Committee.

The Committee will be notified upon official confirmation of the appointments by ODE.

## **Scoping for a Center of Excellence (CoE) Continued**

**Presented by Wes Rivers**

Members discussed multiple structural and functional components of the CoE, including:

- **Academic Partnerships:**  
The committee explored establishing affiliate faculty roles with institutions such as OHSU and PSU. These partnerships could strengthen academic alignment, improve access to university expertise, and create opportunities for student engagement in statewide prevention work.
- **Evidence Base and Framework Development:**  
A proposed sixth pillar was introduced, emphasizing the integration of risk and protective factor systems into the CoE's foundational evidence base.
- **Local Coordination and System Support:**  
Discussion identified that Oregon communities vary significantly in capacity and structure.
- **Cross-System and Cross-Geographic Considerations:**  
The committee noted the importance of alignment across government systems,

especially in areas where relationships between agencies may be fragmented. Border communities were identified as having unique challenges due to proximity to non-Oregon population centers, sometimes relying on prevention resources located in neighboring states.

- **Existing Community Structures and Local ADPC Support:**

The committee recommended recognizing existing county-level coalitions, such as the Clackamas County Prevention Coalition, as models that could support other communities. Additionally, strengthening the role and capacity of Local ADPCs was identified as a central priority, including support for partnerships and facilitation where needed.

- **External Partner Engagement:**

The committee was informed of growing interest from national prevention research partners. NIH/NIDA leadership has expressed support and requested follow-up meetings to explore how their research expertise may complement Oregon's prevention system-building efforts.

### **ODE Public Comment:**

ODE recommends that the Oregon-based clearinghouse include a tag or indicator showing alignment with the Oregon Health Education Standards. Existing analysis that maps these standards has proven extremely useful for schools, particularly in communicating with their communities
