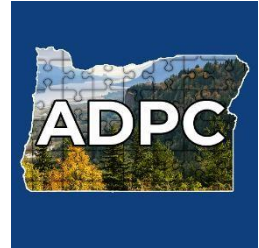

Director's Updates

Presented by Director Dolph

Alcohol and Drug Policy Commission

- Commissioner Tony Vezina will be rotating off as Chair. Commissioner Debby Jones has been unanimously selected as the Commission's new Chair.
- Commissioner Sharon Dursi Martin will serve as the new Vice-Chair.
- The next Commission meeting will focus on the Q2 update of the Comprehensive Plan.
- The Commission will take August off and will reconvene in September for a deep-dive financial analysis in alignment with HB 3321.

Recovery Committee Update

- The Committee held an exercise to align work with the recovery-oriented system of care framework, exploring how individual-level efforts connect to statewide outcomes. Additional guidelines for agencies and programs will be developed.

Treatment Committee Update

- Currently designing provider landscape assessment to identify measurable baselines for various aspects of the treatment work plan. The goal is to be able to measure impact by redistributing survey next year.

Health & Safety Interventions Committee Update

- Meeting cadence has been changed to meeting on the last Tuesday of each month
- Continuing discussion on naloxone access and distribution.
- Reviewing issues related to expired and soon to expire naloxone, as well as potential strategies for redistribution.

Oregon Youth Addiction Alliance Update

- Held a 6-month review and celebration of accomplishments.
- OYAA members are collaborating with Recovery committee to develop best practices for Recovery Community Centers and youth.

Third Horizon HB 3321 Update

Presented by Third Horizon Strategies

Tym Rourke thanked participants for their contributions and noted that the level of responses received met the project's needs. Four surveys were launched for school districts, providers, college campuses, and primary prevention work.

The survey officially closed on June 19, 2026.

Final response counts:

- 75 providers
- 8 college campuses
- 60 school or school districts
- 100 prevention professionals across Oregon

The finalized report is scheduled to be submitted to the legislature in September after analysis.

Scoping for a Center of Excellence (CoE) Continued

Presented by Chair Jones, Co-Chair Pimentel, ADPC Staff

The committee reviewed and refined six Center of Excellence (CoE) pillars, including a centralized clearinghouse, tiered workforce pathways, emerging-trend response, translation functions, community coordination, and risk/protective factor integration. Members agreed specifications for the clearinghouse and workforce development pillars are now clear.

The group highlighted strong guardrails to prevent scope creep into intervention or treatment, including definitions of universal, selective, and indicated prevention and protocols for redirecting higher-tier

needs. Members discussed the need for an effective intake process to ensure requests remain within prevention scope.

The COE should complement, not duplicate, existing technical assistance resources by serving as a navigator and connector. Workforce development should focus on competencies and pathways, not solely certification, with ORCPP identified as a key complementary partner.

Wes Rivers will review additional commentary and incorporate into the draft.
