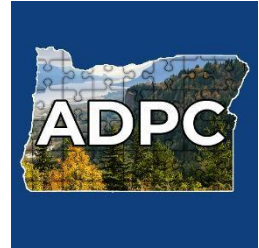

Welcome and Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 10:30AM. Roll call was conducted, and quorum was established.

Director's Updates

Presented by Director Dolph

Alcohol and Drug Policy Commission

- The full Commission met earlier in July to provide the first 6-month update of the Comprehensive Plan
- The Commission is taking August off and will return in September to review:
 - Substance Use Disorder Financial Assessment
 - Household 3321 Primary Prevention Assessment
 - Funding flows, findings, and recommendations across the state.

Recovery Committee Update

- Currently working with OYAA to define recovery community centers and add-on specific best practices for RCCs that serve youth

Treatment Committee Update

- Advancing work on discharge processes.
- Implementing ASAM 4
- Designing a provider landscape assessment to establish measurable baselines across key components of the treatment work plan.
- Planning to redistribute the survey next year to evaluate impact and progress.

Health & Safety Interventions Committee Update

- Discussing a naloxone toolkit as a statewide resource
- Senator Reynolds will be in attendance in August to discuss legislation related to syringe service programs

- Currently preparing for an upcoming youth summit.
- Defining Recovery Community Center for youth and young adults

Local Opioid Settlement Board

- Meeting in August, providing final recommendations to OHA.
- Work underway to develop an RFGP (request for grant proposals) planned for release this fall.
- FAQs and webinars will be available due to early interest.
- ADPC has launched a data work group to collaborate with the Opioid Settlement Board on recommending allocations for a statewide substance use disorder data system.

Committee Recruitment Update

Presented by Wes Rivers

Multiple committee transitions triggered a proactive recruitment round.

Prevention committee applications are ongoing, but targeted outreach is beginning to ensure balanced statewide representation.

Updated seats needs include:

- **Southern Oregon** representation, especially from CCOs or FQHCs.
- **Eastern Oregon** representation, particularly related to early childhood, human development, and overdose prevention.
- **Coastal representation**, as only two current members represents the southern coast.
- **Rural Oregon** voices and flexibility in filling the commissioner-related seat focused previously on criminal justice and youth.

Recruitment details:

- Outreach materials (flyer & QR code) will be shared at HIDTA Prevention Summit.
- Application link will be distributed via email.
- Recruitment will stay open for approximately **one month** before reviewing applications.

- Application review will include committee members and can occur during an executive session.

COE Governance

Presented by Chair Jones, Co-Chair Pimentel, ADPC Staff

Members discussed two main roles the committee could have: **advisory** and **oversight**.

Advisory: Publicly advising on priorities, policy, and implementation based on legislative direction and comprehensive plans.

Oversight: Actively holding an entity accountable to standards, ensuring compliance, using mechanisms such as contractual obligations.

Advisory work already aligns with the committee's statutory role under HB 2929. Oversight represents a more intensive governance commitment.

Governance Structure Scenarios – Key Questions Raised

ADPC Staff Wes Rivers encouraged members to consider:

- If ADPC does *not* oversee the COE, who else could reasonably do it?
- How would alternative oversight bodies interface with multiple state agencies and statewide prevention goals?
- What governance structure provides the clearest accountability, cross-sector alignment, and operational clarity?
- The COE should include ways to gather feedback from people using its services, so the committee can understand what's working and what needs improvement.

Guidance for Next Steps

- Continue reflecting on oversight vs. advisory roles over a 5-year time horizon.
- Think broadly about alternative oversight options if not ADPC.
- Prioritize reviewing the upcoming HB 3321 assessment draft, which will inform future governance conversations.
