- Youth leaders shared early recommendations for how recovery centers can better serve young people. Their feedback includes the need for transportation, clear age-range guidelines, trauma-informed staff training, and smooth transitions between youth and adult services.

Vote on Final RCC Definition

Presented by Chair Vezina

Committee reviewed the *core definition* of Recovery Community Centers (RCCs), including:

Non-residential, peer-operated centers with a paid director and recovery staff.

Offer drop-in hours, peer support, recovery and social support services.

Participants include youth and adults experiencing substance use challenges or in remission.

Services should be free of charge.

If culturally specific services are not available, centers must *make an attempt* to direct individuals to appropriate resources.

RCCs to help build recovery capital including social activities, peer support, resource navigation, mutual support meetings, employment connections, advocacy, education, and volunteer opportunities.

ACTION ITEM:

Motion to approve the core definition entered and seconded

Roll-call vote: unanimous approval from all present committee members

Youth-specific RCC additions will be reviewed in June, with a vote planned for July.

Data

Suggested Metrics from Committee Discussion

- Utilization numbers (unique individuals, number of visits).
- Number of contacts/engagements.
- Participant demographics.
- Progress toward personal goals.
- Employment and housing outcomes.
- Outreach activities completed.
- Unduplicated service counts and encounter totals.
- Recovery capital indicators (personal, social, community, cultural).
- Abstinence as *one* possible measure—captured sensitively, e.g., asking whether abstinence is part of the person's recovery plan.
- Reduction in justice system involvement or recidivism.
- Expenditures and cost tracking for accountability.

Framework Presented

- Data should align with the RCC definition and the domains of recovery capital.
- Potential use of the BARC-10 instrument for individual-level progress measurement.
- Suggestion to conduct a yearly anonymous point-in-time survey for drop-in participants.
- Members encouraged to send existing internal data templates to support building a unified statewide reporting model.
