Organizational Business

The meeting was called to order at 1:00 PM. Roll call was conducted, and quorum was established.

The Recovery Subcommittee welcomed new committee member Brian Hodges.

Director's Updates

Presented by Will Burchard (Annaliese out)

Treatment Committee Update

- Currently designing provider landscape assessment to identify measurable baselines for various aspects of the treatment work plan
- The goal is to be able to measure impact by redistributing survey next year

Next meeting: July 8, 2026

Prevention Committee Update

- Continuing discussion around a primary Center of Excellence (CoE)
- Receiving updates on implementation of HB 3321 – Primary Prevention Assessment Work

Next meeting: June 24, 2026

Health & Safety Interventions Committee Update

- Meeting cadence has been changed to meeting on the last Tuesday of each month
- Continuing discussion on naloxone access and distribution
- Reviewing issues related to expired and soon to expire naloxone, as well as potential strategies for redistribution

Next meeting: June 30, 2026

Oregon Youth Addiction Alliance Update

- Held a 6-month review and celebration of accomplishments
- OYAA members are collaborating with Recovery committee to develop best practices for Recovery Community Centers and youth

Next meeting: July 8, 2026

Local Opioid Settlement Board Update:

- Anticipated release of grant funding will be released in Fall 2026
- Funding will consist of a single round of one-time awards totaling \$13 million

Youth Recovery Centers

Presented by Oregon Youth Addiction Alliance (OYAA)

OYAA members introduced themselves and presented themes/consensus recommendations related to youth orientated Recovery Community Centers.

Key points from youth presenters:

- Clear boundaries and safety practices are essential.
- Youth need safe places to report misconduct without fear of retaliation.
- Better access to services.
- Cultural relevance matters.
- Engaging activities help youth stay connected.
- Youth are a part of decision making.
- Youth should not be forced to attend services.

Agreed next steps:

- Add youth-specific language to the existing Recovery Community Center (RCC) definition, possibly as an added paragraph. **A vote is planned for August 2026.**
- Create youth-focused “standards” to share with OHA so future youth recovery programs can be held to these expectations.
- Give committee members time to review all youth recommendations before voting.

Recovery Center data and measures

Presented by Will Burchard, ADPC

Will Burchard highlighted ideas for creating unified statewide data collection across Recovery Community Centers.

The proposal included three types of data:

1. Center-level information, such as number of visits or activities.
2. Peer services information, such as goal progress and recovery capital.
3. A point-in-time survey that gathers information from all visitors during one period.

The BARC-10 recovery capital tool was suggested to measure growth in recovery strengths over time.

Members shared several concerns:

- The proposed data list was large, and many centers may not have capacity to collect it.
- Different organizations use different systems, making shared reporting difficult.
- Collecting more data may take time away from direct client support.

Suggestions included:

- Starting with a small pilot group of centers that already collect much of this information.
- Creating clear definitions of each measure before statewide reporting begins.
- Asking centers what data they find truly useful and manageable.
- Exploring whether unified reporting could reduce duplication across state grants.
