### **Organizational Business**

### **Focusing on the Inner Context (EPIS)**

#### **Presented by**

Mitch Doing (ADPC) provided an overview of the EPIS framework: Exploration, Preparation, Implementation, and Sustainment. Today's focus was on the Inner Context, which involves organizational factors such as staffing, supervision, leadership practices, workflows, and quality monitoring. These factors shape how programs operate day-to-day and influence their ability to carry out evidence-based practices.

Members were encouraged to think about what information only providers can offer - details that do not appear in claims data or statewide reporting.

Examples referenced included waitlists, staffing patterns, training needs, transitions between levels of care, and internal procedures that affect implementation success.

- Short points raised during this segment:  
Many operational realities—like hiring challenges, retention issues, referral pathways, or fidelity to practice models—are best understood through direct provider input.

- A comprehensive understanding of these elements would help identify barriers, refine priorities, and support implementation of the comprehensive plan.

## **Comprehensive Plan: Designing the Provider/Landscape Assessment**

### **Presented by Tym Rourke**

Third Horizon shared experiences from other states where provider surveys helped identify issues such as financial instability, delays in payment, wait times, workforce shortages, and administrative barriers. He noted that strong communication and outreach are essential for achieving high response rates.

Several themes surfaced during feedback:

- Referral and Transitions
- Workforce and Staffing Issues
- Access and Capacity
- Complex Client Needs
- Funding and Administrative Barrier
- Telehealth and Documentation Requirements
- Cultural Responsiveness and Quality of Care

## **Public Comment**

### **Presented by Chair**

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One written public comment was submitted by a treatment court analyst. The comment described significant barriers faced by justice-involved individuals. In some cases, providers tell clients they do not need treatment even when a court has mandated it, which can lead to further legal consequences and missed opportunities for intervention.
