Organizational Business

The meeting was called to order at 3:03 PM. Roll call was conducted and quorum was established.

Director's Updates

Presented by Director Dolph

Recovery Committee Update

- Committee continues work on Recovery Community Centers (RCCs).
- Developed a definition for Recovery Community Centers.
- Drafting guidelines for state agencies that fund Recovery Community Centers.
- Working to identify data elements and performance metrics for ongoing collection.
- **Next meeting: June 18, 2026**

Prevention Committee Update

- Continuing discussion regarding development of a Primary Prevention Center of Excellence (CoE).
- Received updates on implementation of HB 3321 Primary Prevention Assessment work.
- **Next meeting: June 24, 2026**

Health & Safety Interventions Committee Update

- Committee meeting schedule has changed to the last Tuesday of each month.
- Continuing discussions regarding naloxone access, redistribution, and utilization.
- Reviewed issues related to expired and soon-to-expire naloxone and potential strategies to improve redistribution and efficient use.

Oregon Youth Addiction Alliance

- Oregon Youth Addiction Alliance will hold a six-month accomplishments review and celebration.
- Alliance members are collaborating with the Recovery Committee to develop best practices and guidelines for Recovery Community Centers serving youth.

Local Opioid Settlement Board

- Oregon Health Authority is developing the next Request for Grant Applications (RFGA).
 - Anticipated release is scheduled for fall 2026.
 - Funding will consist of a single round of one-time awards totaling approximately \$13 million.
 - Reminder that the Local Opioid Settlement Collaborative continues to meet monthly to support coordination with local partners.

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Comprehensive Plan: Continuing Design of the Provider/Landscape Assessment

An overview of the ongoing Provider/Landscape Assessment process supporting implementation of the Comprehensive Plan was presented.

Assessment Development Update

- Staff reviewed the assessment framework and its connection to implementation science and system improvement efforts.
- The committee previously identified approximately **84 potential assessment questions**, which staff has since organized into thematic categories.
- Members were reminded that the current phase remains a brainstorming and prioritization process; questions will be refined and narrowed before survey deployment.

Committee Discussion Highlights

Members discussed principles for prioritizing assessment questions, including:

- Aligning questions with Comprehensive Plan implementation goals and outcomes.
- Focusing on system-level information rather than highly granular operational details.
- Avoiding questions that imply commitments, funding opportunities, or solutions beyond the scope of the Comprehensive Plan.
- Identifying information already available through existing datasets, licensing records, workforce surveys, or other state efforts to reduce duplication.
- Ensuring questions are actionable and capable of informing future decision-making.
- Considering how responses could be measured over time to assess change.
- Evaluating whether providers are the most appropriate source of information for particular questions.
- Recognizing that some client-specific barriers may not be accurately represented through provider responses alone.

Survey Design Considerations

Members commented on several considerations for future survey development:

- Using branching survey logic to tailor questions to different provider types.
- Limiting survey length and administrative burden to improve participation rates.
- Maximizing use of structured response options and minimizing open-ended questions where possible.
- Allowing organizations to coordinate internally so the most appropriate staff contribute to survey responses.
- Considering qualitative interviews or other supplemental methods to gather deeper contextual information.
- Ensuring participation from a broad range of provider types, including behavioral health, peer-run organizations, primary care providers, and rural/frontier service providers.
- Exploring strategies to ensure underrepresented populations and communities are reflected in assessment findings.

Staff indicated that feedback from committee members will inform the next draft of the assessment and prioritization process.
