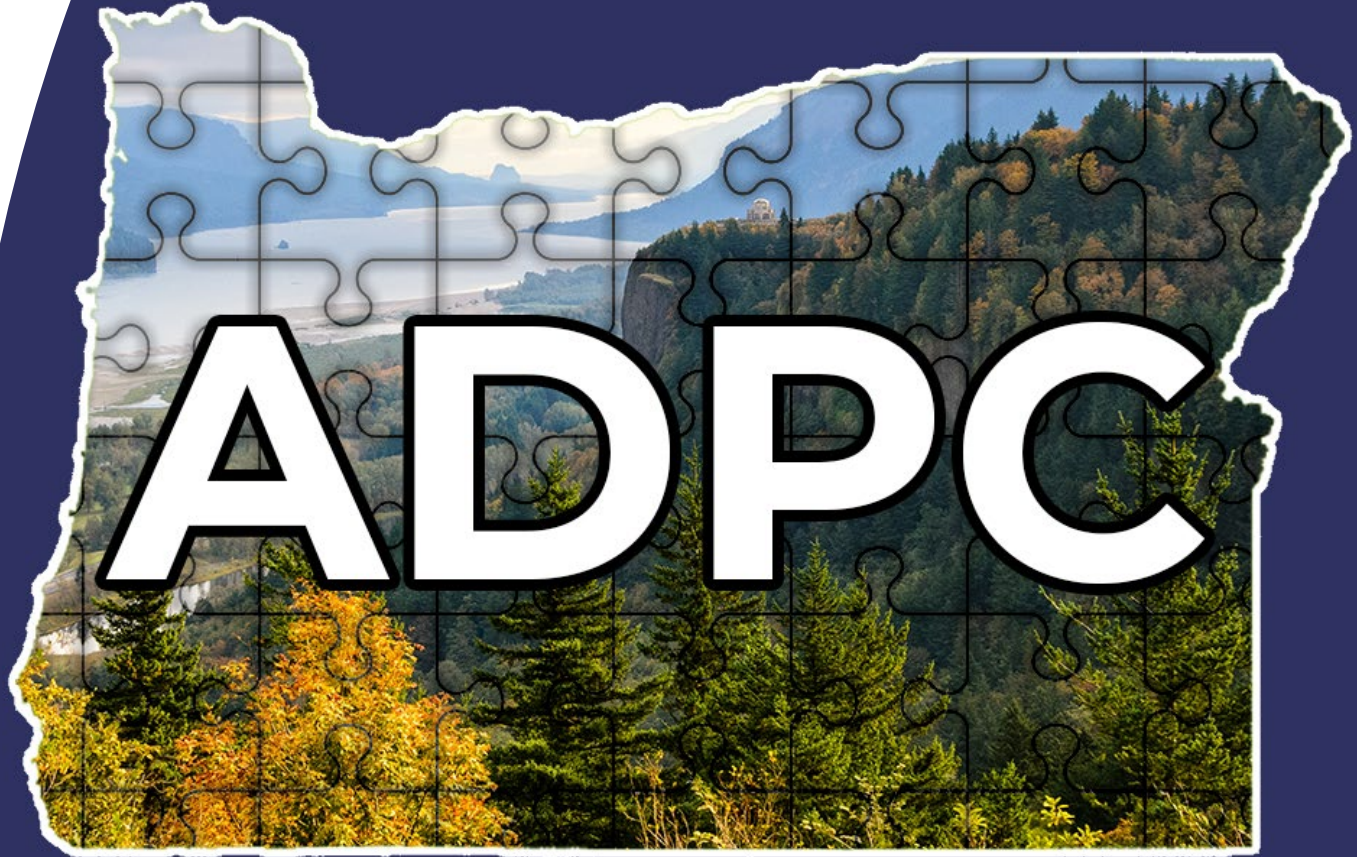

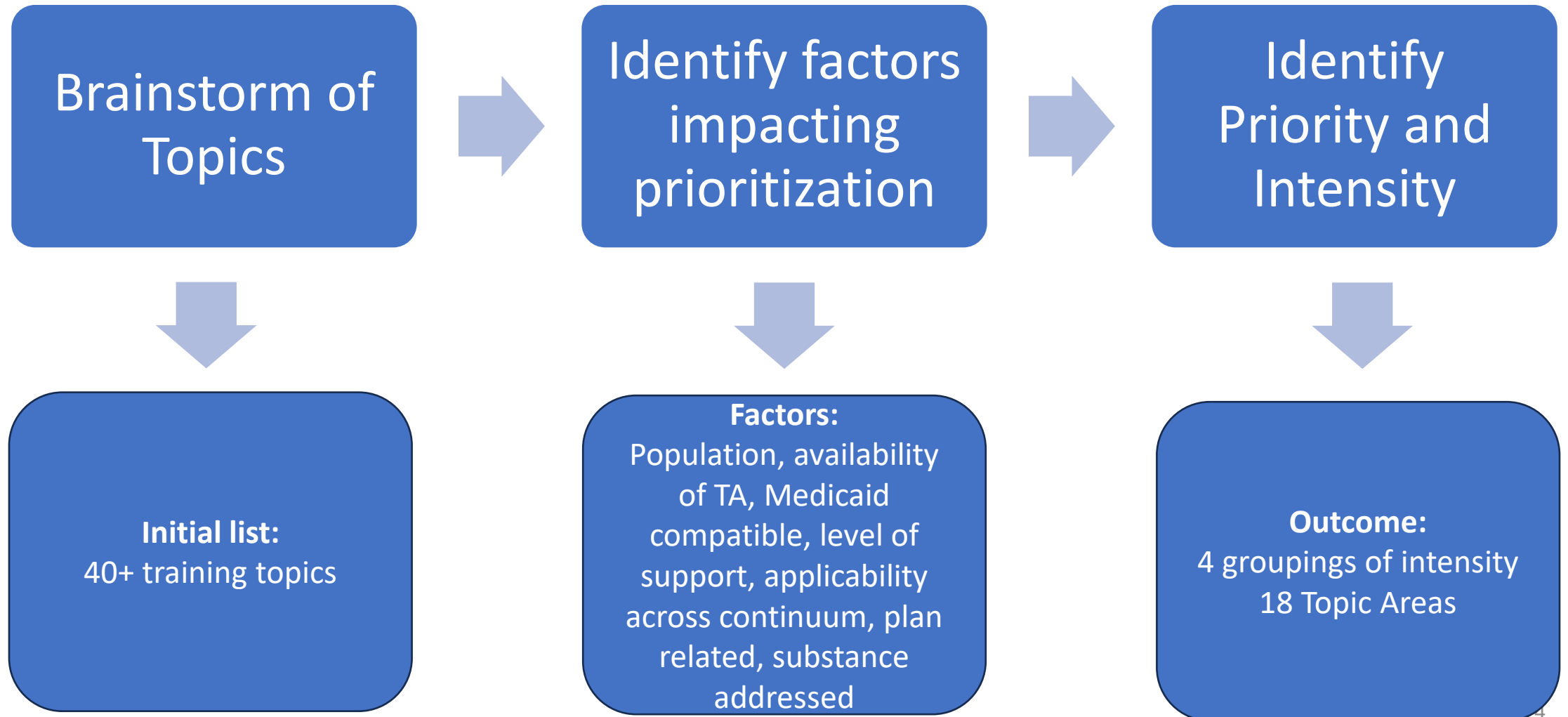
Public Comment

Best Practice Workgroup

- In November 2025 leadership of Region 10 technical assistance centers agreed to a future collaboration for a specific intensive technical assistance project and to receive priorities from the committee as one source of information for their annual needs assessment and planning process.
- Workgroup proposed in April 2026 to support various Comprehensive plan
- Workgroup established in May 2026
- Meeting monthly, last Tuesday of the month.

First related action step: Best Practices Workgroup convenes and identify priority areas of EBP/ TBP technical assistance, necessary advisory literature, and other supports to inform subsequent year's activities.

Technical Assistance Priorities



Some terms

Training of Trainers (ToT)- Training and technical assistance that provide skills, knowledge, and materials to train individuals to deliver trainings on specific topics (i.e. Training to become a Trainer).

Intensive Technical Assistance (ITA)- Technical assistance that supports the implementation of a practice within a system, community, or organization, over a period of time via consultative support.

Targeted Technical Assistance (TTA)- Technical assistance with a particular audience (provider type, setting, etc...) to support skill adoption and skill improvement of EBPs within individual providers (e.g. Multi-day training).

Universal Technical Assistance (UTA)- Technical assistance designed to provide information or initial exposure to particular practices, ideas, or concepts (e.g. Webinars, short trainings)

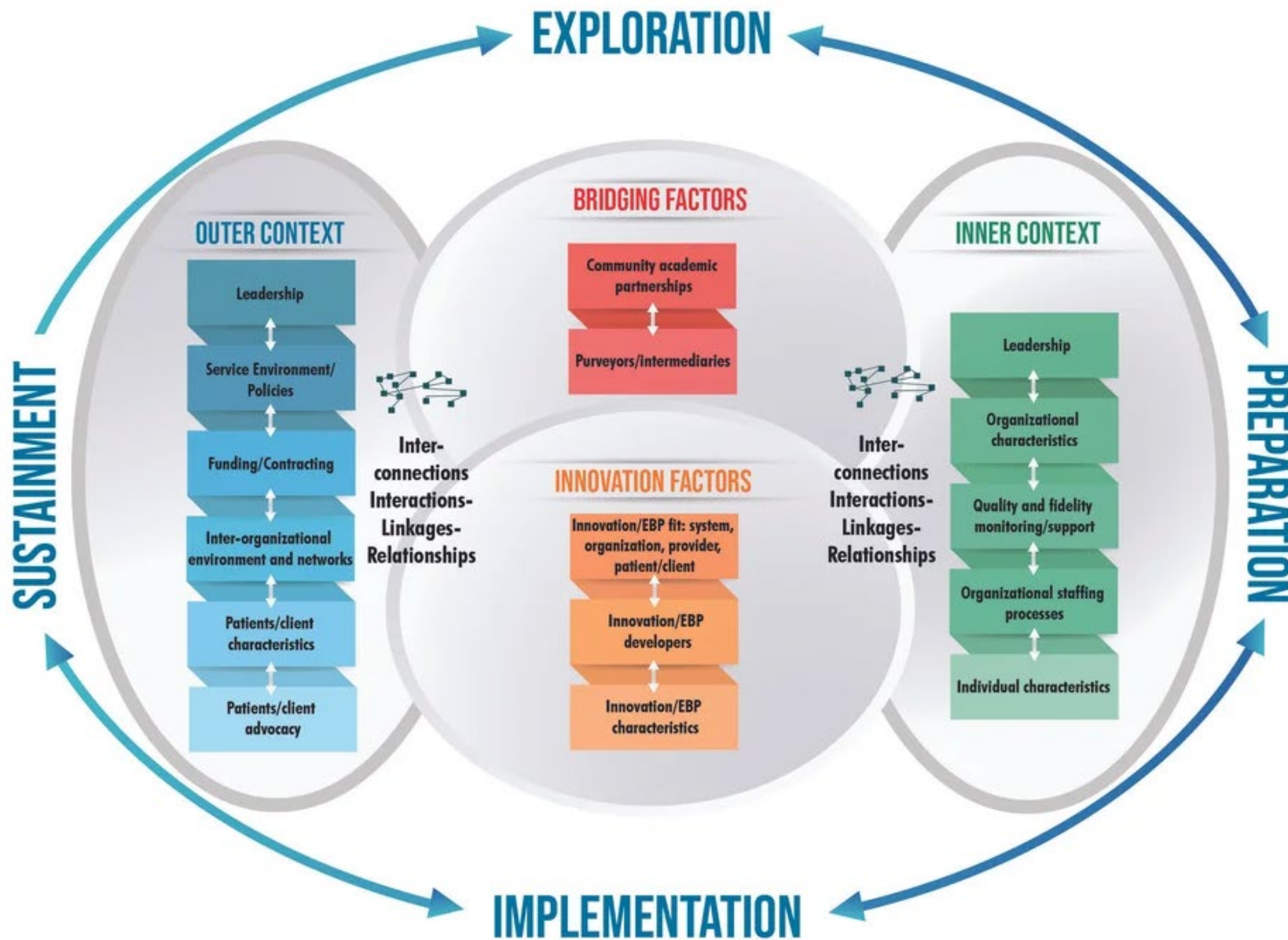

EPIS Framework

Describes the process(es), factors, and the interaction of the “system” and “programs” as it relates implementation efforts. It also is a model that can be used to provide some structure to implementation at each level.

EPIS outlines the ways that both the inner context (program level) relates to the outer context (systems) and the factors from each that make implementation and sustainability feasible.

ACHIEVES WHAT?

REDUCES

- Substance Use
- Substance Use Disorders
- SUD related Deaths
- SUD Disparities

EVIDENCE BASE

SUPPORTS

- What shows this will be effective?
- What supports the implementation and sustainment of these strategies?
- Where else has this been done before?

COMMUNITY INPUT

ENGAGEMENT

- Is this what the community wants and needs?
- Who do we need to engage with?
- How do we best engage with them?

STRATEGY

PLAN

- How do we go about this?
- Are we leveraging existing information, programs, funding, etc... to accomplish this?
- Are we suggesting something new entirely?

MEASURES

DATA

- Can progress be measured?
- Can it be continuously monitored?
- How we will evaluate the success of these strategies?
- How will we report these outcomes?
