The Oregon Department of Aviation (ODAV) is a state agency comprised of a staff of 16 employees. Founded in 1921, ODAV was the first aviation department in the United States and predates the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA), ODAV works in collaboration with cities, counties, business and industry, the State of Oregon, the Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT), the Port of Portland and the FAA. ODAV operates and maintains 28 State Airports of nearly 100 public use airports in Oregon.

#### DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT










