ORS and OAR Updates

 Items from HB 2402 and the resulting completed OARs.

22) "Rural Oregon" means any area within the state of Oregon that was not officially designated or delineated as a Metropolitan Statistical Area by the U.S. Office of Management and Budget as of September 2018.

ORS and OAR Updates

- 738-124-0020 COAR and ROAR Project Eligibility
- (1) Project Eligibility.
 - (a) A project is eligible only if it has not been completed prior to the application deadline set by the Department.
 - (b) A project is not eligible if its nature is to provide a match for a project or program that is funded with other Department funds or the Connect Oregon Fund.
 - (c) A project is not eligible if it is prohibited by the Revenue Use Policy.
- (2) Additional project eligibility requirement for COAR applications: A project is eligible only if it is located on an airport that is open to flight operations by the public.
- (3) Additional project eligibility requirement for ROAR applications: A projects is eligible if it will increase commercial passenger travel between an airport in Rural Oregon and another airport in Oregon.

COAR Grant Priorities

- 1st priority Assist with match requirements for FAA
 Airport Improvement Program (AIP) grants
- 2nd priority Safety and infrastructure development
- 3rd priority Aviation-related economic benefits related to airports



COAR Minimum Match Requirements

Both FAA and non-FAA eligible projects: the level of sponsor/owner grant matching requirements are based upon category of airport as defined in the Oregon Aviation Plan.

Category 1a – Commercial Primary: 50%

Category 1b – Other Commercial Non-Primary (less than 10k enplanements): 35%

Category 2 – Business: 25%

Category 3 – Regional: 10%

Category 4 – Community: 10%

Category 5 – Low Activity: 5%



ACT Grading

- Using ORS 367.084:
- (6) In selecting transportation projects the commission shall consider:
- (a) Whether a proposed transportation project reduces transportation costs for Oregon businesses or improves access to jobs and sources of labor;
- **(b)**Whether a proposed transportation project results in an economic benefit to this state;
- (c) Whether a proposed transportation project is a critical link connecting elements of Oregon's transportation system that will measurably improve utilization and efficiency of the system;
- (d) How much of the cost of a proposed transportation project can be borne by the applicant for the grant from any source other than the Connect Oregon Fund;
- (e) Whether a proposed transportation project is ready for construction; and
- **(f)**Whether a proposed transportation project has a useful life expectancy that offers maximum benefit to the state.

Meets the Standard

(A) "Meets" means that the Applicant explained in a thorough and specific manner how the project meets the criterion and provided thorough evidence, including specific facts, specific examples, reliable figures, or detailed citations to supporting attachments to the application to support the Applicant's explanation.

Somewhat Meets the Standard

(B) "Somewhat Meets" means that the Applicant provided a general, superficial or non-specific explanation how the project meets the criterion or provided only limited or incomplete supporting evidence to support the Applicant's explanation.

Does Not Meet the Standard

- (C) "Does Not Meet" means that either:
 - (i) The Applicant reported that the project did not meet the criterion; or
 - (ii) The Applicant provided an incomplete or implausible explanation of how the project meets the criterion or provided no evidence or only minimal, implausible or unreliable evidence to support the Applicant's explanation.



Tasks for the Aviation Review Committee (ARC)

- Consider the application information, application scores and the ACT review grades.
- Break ties among scores within Priorities 1-3.
 - ❖ Priority 1, 2 & 3 must be ranked and vetted by the ARC.
- The end result will be a final ranked list of applications for Board recommendation.

Breaking Ties

In prioritizing applications submitted for COAR funds, the ARC may consider the following factors:

- (a) Applicant that is able to bear the most cost.
- (b) Projects related to safety or infrastructure.
- (c) Quantity of projects applied for at an airport, within the same grant cycle.
- (d) Regional significance.
