


























#### ABOUT US

The Oregon Department of Aviation (ODAV) is a state agency comprised of a staff of 16 employees. Founded in 1921, ODAV was the first aviation department in the United States and predates the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA), ODAV works in collaboration with cities. counties, business and industry, the State of Oregon, the Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT), the Port of Portland and the FAA. ODAV operates and maintains 28 State Airports of nearly 100 public use airports in Oregon.

communities and the state.



#### DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT



I have taken the opportunity to not only meet with ODAV staff but to visit close to 60 of Oregon's airports. During these visits, we have made efforts to visit with legislators in their home districts to not only educate about ODAV but to highlight projects at their airports. We have also worked to meet with stakeholders on and around Oregon's airports.

The agency is undergoing tremendous change. We are focusing on driving the agency forward to address the dramatic changes that are happening in aviation while seeking to improve service delivery. 








































ODA operations funds are used for all staffing and operational needs of the agency




