
COAR Grants

- As of April 2025, the COAR grant funds have contributed \$20.8 million toward total project costs of almost \$308 million.
- Inspections: After completing 40+ inspections in 2023-24, the COAR program has returned to standard levels of grant closeouts and pending inspections. Program Coordinators expect to complete 10-12 project inspections in 2025.
- Airport Visits: ODAV team has visited ~80 airports!

Land-Use & Airspace

Aeronautical Studies

- 97+ completed so far this year.
 - Including assessments for cranes, housing developments, solar installations, communication towers, and utility projects.
 - Several of which were identified as potential hazards to aviation.

Land-Use

- Total land-use notices and development permits reviewed from local and state jurisdictions to date this year: **94**.
 - New this year: accurately tracking total land-use cases reviewed

GIS Implementation

- Staff expects to share draft maps internally and with agency partners in Q2.
 - Intended for airport infrastructure inventory and Part 77 surface monitoring.
 - Targeting a go-live date by end of 2025 for both internal and public accessibility.

Procurement & Contract Administration

Procurement responsibilities officially transitioned from ODOT to ODAV on **July 1, 2024**. Since then, ODAV has been successfully managing its procurement processes in-house, including Invitations to Bid (ITBs), Requests for Proposals (RFPs), contracting, and direct collaboration with the Department of Justice (DoJ), achieving positive turnaround times.

Key Improvements:

- •Enhanced procedures and greater contract consistency.
- •Strengthened understanding of procurement processes across the organization.
- •Fully Utilizing OregonBuys for majority of procurement contracts and all related processes (solicitation, purchase orders, invoice payment)

Organizational Upgrades:

- •Reorganized and streamlined ODAV's procurement and contract document filing and tracking systems for greater efficiency.
- •Partnering with the DoJ to review all procurement and contract documents, with the goal of resetting templates and forms to better align with ODAV's needs.

Legislative

SB792

-Authorizes the Oregon Department of Aviation to establish by rule fees related to airports and aircraft.

March 24 Hearing Held

HB3479

-Requires commercial operators of unmanned aircraft systems to maintain liability insurance

March 24 Hearing Held

HB2153

-Increases the tax on aircraft fuel usable in aircraft operated by turbine engines and adjusts the rate biennially according to any increase in the Consumer Price Index.

March 24 Hearing Held

SB5506

-Limits for the six-year period beginning July 1, 2025, payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by various state agencies for capital construction.

SB5504

-Limits biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Oregon Department of Aviation.
