Just how busy are we?

The Airport ADS-B reports 6,295 flight operations with an additional 800ish Glider flights year to date, The airport has 3 T-Hangar spaces (one 10 unit to be built this winter) as well as 3 airport owned box hangars and 3 privately owned box hangars that provide storage for approximately 60 aircrafts. We currently have about 25 on a hangar waiting list.

The airport strives to provide the essential services needed in the Hood River valley as a base for emergency response in fire fighting and emergency services as well as urgent medical care.


