  - An association of Oregon's pilots and other airport users
  - A state-wide network of all people embracing aviation



The object of this corporation is and shall be...

- ...to cooperate with other organizations in advancing the interests of aviation in Oregon...
  - Partner to advance all aviation: "No pilot/business/user/airport left behind"
  - Advocate for equitable and fair treatment for all Oregon aviators
  - Embrace emerging technologies



The object of this corporation is and shall be...

- ...to promote and encourage the construction, maintenance and improvement of airports and landing fields...
  - Pilots/aircraft require places to fly to/from
  - Airfields require pilots/aircraft to use them

  - Name changed to Oregon Pilots Association



- June 2025: Latest Board of Directors:
  - OPA restored as a mutual benefit association, strengthening its general advocacy and lobbying position
  - Created Oregon Air Safety and Education Foundation (OASEF) as an IRS 510 (c)(3) public benefit educational charity, providing aviation scholarships
  - Reestablishing the vitality of OPA and the revival of OPA chapters

• Localized, grassroots "clubs" with shared interests and values, camaraderie, community involvement and education




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  - Support airport sponsors and management in the utility and promotion of airports
