Pursuant to Oregon Revised Statutes (ORS) 305.385, the Director of the Oregon Department of Revenue has requested that the Oregon Department of Consumer and Business Services suspend Respondent's Oregon general supervising electrician's license number 2922S.

The Director of the Oregon Department of Revenue has determined that:

- 1. Respondent has neglected or refused to file tax return(s) or pay tax, and
2. The Department of Revenue has been unable to obtain collect the tax through other collection methods, and
3. Respondent has not filed a good-faith appeal before the Department of Revenue.

As described below, Respondent is entitled to a hearing in this matter. Unless this matter is resolved, Respondent's Oregon general supervising electrician license number 2922S will be suspended pursuant to ORS 305.385(4)(c), and will remain suspended until the Department of Revenue certifies you are in good standing.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO HEARING

Respondent is entitled to a hearing as provided by the Administrative Procedures Act, Oregon Revised Statutes, chapter 183. If Respondent requests a hearing, the request must be in writing and filed with the Building Codes Division. The postmarked date on the request for hearing must be no later than 20 days from the date the Notice of Intended Action (Notice) is served on the Respondent. If this Notice was served to Respondent in person, the service date is the date Respondent received this Notice. If this Notice was served through the mail, the service date is the day the Notice was mailed, not the day Respondent received it.

If a request for hearing is not received with a postmark dated within 20 days, Respondent's right to a hearing is considered waived. Mail hearing requests to Building Codes Division, Enforcement Section, P.O. Box 14470, Salem, Oregon, 97309.

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FINAL ORDER

As of: June 4, 2014

1 Respondent has the right to be represented by legal counsel. ORS 183.457 provides that a  
2 corporation may be represented by an authorized representative at the hearing. If Respondent  
3 requests a hearing, Respondent will be notified of the time and place of the hearing and be given  
4 information on procedures, right of representation and other rights of parties relating to the hearing  
5 before it begins.

#### 6 NOTICE TO ACTIVE DUTY SERVICE MEMBERS


7 Active duty service members have a right to stay proceedings under the federal

#### 12 NOTICE OF FINAL ORDER

13 If Respondent does not timely request a hearing, withdraws a hearing request, notifies the  
14 Director or the administrative law judge that they will not appear, or fails to appear at a scheduled  
15 hearing, the Director will issue a Final Order by Default. If the Director issues a Final Order by  
16 Default, it designates the file, including any materials submitted by Respondent that relate to this  
17 matter, as the record for purpose of proving a prima facie case.

18 Respondent is entitled to judicial review of any final order issued in the matter of this Notice  
19 of a Intent to Suspend. Judicial review may be obtained by filing a petition for review with the  
20 Oregon Court of Appeals within 60 days after the Final Order is served. See ORS 183.482. If the  
21 Order was served in person, the service date is the date Respondent received the Order. If the Order  
22 was served through the mail, the service date is the day the Order was mailed, not the day it was  
23 received by Respondent. If Respondent does not file a petition for judicial review within 60 days,  
24 Respondent will lose the right to appeal. The phone number for the Oregon Court of Appeals is
