Future Ready Oregon Round 4 Grant Awards

Approved by the Oregon State Apprenticeship and Training Council. Awards are listed alphabetically.

Klamath County School District - Bonanza, Oregon

Klamath County School District, which serves nearly 7000 students in approximately 6000 square miles in Southern Oregon, will expand its existing construction Pre-Apprenticeship Training Program (PATP) to Bonanza High School, in the rural and frontier community of Bonanza, Oregon. Grant funds will also provide at least 95 students access to student support services, program equipment, and training supplies. The grant award will also provide Henley High School, in Klamath Falls, Oregon, with additional equipment for their existing preapprenticeship training location. Expanding this existing PATP will improve access and engagement opportunities for students while also reducing socio-economic barriers.

Award Amount: \$228,200

Oregon Coast Community College, Newport, Oregon

Oregon Coast Community College (OCCC) serves students and community members in rural Lincoln County. Given its geographic location and high percentage of non-traditional students, OCCC is uniquely positioned to reach rural and frontier communities. The grant award will be used to create OCCC's first Pre-Apprenticeship Training Program whose focus will be on the construction industry. **Award Amount: \$299,561**

Southwest Oregon Workforce Investment Board, Coos Bay, Oregon

Southwest Oregon Workforce Investment Board (SOWIB) is one of Oregon's 9 Workforce Investment Boards that serves Coos, Curry, and Douglas counties. This grant award will allow SOWIB to expand its existing Medical Assistant Registered Apprenticeship Program by adding more training agents and increasing enrollment. With an open enrollment model and online access to related training, this increased accessibility will support Registered Apprentices statewide in this critically understaffed healthcare profession. **Award Amount: \$207,178**









Southwestern Oregon Community College, Coos Bay, Oregon

Southwestern Oregon Community College (SWOCC) serves approximately 4000 students in Coos and Curry counties. In response to local employers' requests, SWOCC will create a new Millwright Registered Apprenticeship Program (RAP). The grant award will support SWOCC in creating its new RAP new with skilled personnel, program, training equipment, and provide student support services. SWOCC has extensive experience in supporting veterans, women, low-income, and rural communities, making this collaborative program with industry partners an excellent opportunity for future Millwright Apprentices in southwest Oregon.

Award Amount: \$287,500

West Linn-Wilsonville School District, West Linn, Oregon

West Linn-Wilsonville School District serves more than 9000 students in a 42 square mile area of southern metropolitan Portland. This grant award will create Clackamas County's first manufacturing Pre-Apprenticeship Training Program (PATP) at West Linn High School. Grant funds will support skilled personnel, student support services, training equipment and supplies. Together with 12 industry partners, this new PATP will increase accessibility to high wage jobs and provide an excellent pathway for students looking to join a Registered Apprenticeship Program in manufacturing or related fields. **Award Amount: \$264,186**
