\$18.9 Million in Grant Awards


3-4 Rounds of Funding




- Bureau of Labor and Industries (BOLI) –







Top Application Tips...

- 1. Pre-Apprenticeship? Must have identified RAP w/support letter
- 2. "Key Partner" listed? Must have support letter
- 3. Clear & specific outreach strategies for each Priority Population?
- 4. Student Support Services? Must be a separate line item in budget
- 5. Student wages? Not permitted, but stipends are if need well documented
- 6. Budget scalable? Explain how you can scale your budget if the full amount is not granted.
