Board Chair comments

- Vice Chair Bailey Reports new biennium has started, and new budget conversations are starting to take place. It is also employee appreciation week, and Vice Chair Bailey wanted to make sure to acknowledge all the Board has done this year, the projects it's completed, and express his gratitude at the hard work and dedication that the Agency as a whole, has delivered yet again.

Board member comments

- No comments from the Board currently.

Executive Directors Comments

- No bills directly affected us, except for 581 which expands earned discharge. Previously only eligible to those on probation and local control, and some limited post prison cases. Senate bill 581, as of January 1st, when it goes into effect, will go retroactive to over 5000+ individuals on post-prison supervision could become eligible if they meet the criteria. DOC is currently running a work group to expand their rules to capture that population. The Boards role in this will be rather minimal, but there will be a little bit of



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work to do, and likely some upfront increases to our workload to process those individuals who are eligible. Community Corrections will be submitting the forms to remove those individuals from active supervision. The Boards Budget did very well this season. We were awarded funds to convert our paper files, upwards to 25,000 to an electronic format. Additionally, we were awarded funds to process the juvenile commutations from Governor Brown's tenure. Unfortunately, until the governor signs our current budget bill, we are not able to move forward with the electronic records project, or with hiring any of additional staff that were given to us this session. Continuing resolution, to continue with our current operations, but no changes otherwise within the budget. We will be advised by DAS once this budget is signed and the funds hit our account.

Operations & Policy Analyst Comments

- None from operations – P. Waddell reports - filed a rule amendment for division 85. Reasoning: Under statute, only the board of parole is able to change rules regarding methodology for sex offender suspects. Changed verbiage from “board” to “classifying agencies”. Amended to read “classifying agencies” as there are other entities in Oregon that do these assessments, as they are unable to change rules themselves, they rely on our rules, and this needed to be clearer. Will be adopted and proper notice will be given on 7.28.23.
