

Model Features for Accessible Homes

(ORS 701.525 through 701.530)

Why think about accessibility now?

- To meet current needs if you are a senior or a person with disabilities.
- To plan future features to allow you to "age in place".

 Many features may cost less when done at the time of original construction. Checklist of Possible Features to Upgrade a Home's Accessibility 	
Low glare fixtures and surfaces	Handrail extensions for stairways inside and outside of home

Entryway, garage, sidewalks:	Bathrooms:
Header height of garage door a minimum of 8 feet, to accommodate van access	Adequate access to toilet from either side
Accessible route to sidewalk, front door, garage, and parking	Appropriate toilet height Accessible bathing facility
Consider present or future placement of outside ramps	Handheld shower wand
Solar lighting for outdoor and motion detector lights	Accessible sink with knee space below Accessible/appropriate sink, bath,
Low-maintenance landscaping	and shower controls
Covered entryway	Single lever control faucets with anti-scald temperature control
☐ Ice-resistant walkways Kitchens:	Phone accessible from floor level, in the event of a fall

 Counter space beside refrigerator to facilitate loading and unloading 	Laundry Rooms: Raised front load washer and dryer
Glides on drawers, and easy-to-use recessed cabinet hardware	Combination washer/dryer units to eliminate moving heavy, wet
Sliding shelves in lower cabinets	clothes to dryer
Electric receptacles, garbage disposal, and exhaust fan switches moved to the front of the counter or cabinet	Adequate floor space for wheelchair maneuverability
when safe to do so	Bedrooms:
Accessible range/oven/microwave configuration and controls	Room design large enough for adequate movement around bed
Trash compactors to limit trips to empty the garbage	Built-in storage and dressers to allow clear floor space
☐ Varied countertop and workspace heights	Widened walk-in closet doors,
Pull-out or drop leaf shelves for working	or elimination of closet doors
space	Shelves and rods at various heights
Le and water dispensers on outside of refrigerator door	Placement of bedroom and bath on main floor
Sliding refrigerator shelves
