

2026 Supplemental Grant Solicitation: Jail-based Medications for Opioid Use Disorder Grant Program

Application Due Date: September 5, 2026

Purpose:

The Oregon Jail-based Medications for Opioid Use Disorder (JMOUD) Grant Program was established by the legislature in 2024 Oregon Laws Chapter 70, Section 82. The purpose of the JMOUD Grant Program is to provide opioid use disorder treatment and transition planning services to persons in custody in local correctional facilities and tribal correctional facilities, as defined in Section 17 of Senate Bill 236 (2025).

Eligible Applicants:

Eligible applicants for this supplemental round include:

1. Existing JMOUD grant recipients who have indicated an associated need for additional funding for their MOUD program; or
2. Cities and counties in Oregon that operate a “local correctional facility” and are not currently receiving JMOUD grant funds.

A “local correctional facility” is defined in ORS 169.005 and also means any facility operated by a county supervisory authority as defined in ORS 144.08, including facilities for providing corrections supervision services or custodial services.

An applicant may apply individually or jointly with other eligible applicants.

Program Goals and Priorities:

The goal of the JMOUD Grant Program is to increase the provision of opioid use disorder treatment and transition planning services to adults in custody.

Funds awarded must be used for one or more of the following:

- Provide medication, telemedicine, or any other reasonable treatment to persons in custody with an opioid disorder.
- Develop or operate mobile or nonmobile opioid treatment units.
- Administer screenings for opioid use disorder or risk of an acute opioid withdrawal.
- Facilitate transition planning services for persons in custody who seek or receive opioid use disorder treatment.
- Undertake any other actions reasonably calculated to mitigate operational or structural barriers to providing opioid use disorder treatment in local correctional facilities or tribal correctional facilities, including but not limited to mitigating any lack of secure storage for medication.

Availability and Duration of Funding:

This is a one-time solicitation offering financial support for the grant period beginning October 1, 2025, and ending September 30, 2027.

A total of \$5,741,891 may be made available in grant funds and will be awarded through a formula funding process approved by the Commission. Any amount available over \$3,010,000 is contingent on the Legislature’s approval of a pending request to increase CJC’s spending limitation.

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Funding allocations for new applicants are currently indicated on the 2025-27 JMOUD Formula Funding Table posted on the [CJC website](#).

The 2026 JMOUD Supplemental Funding Table will be posted on the [CJC website](#) by August 12, 2026 and will include funding allocations for existing grant recipients.

Application Timeline:

August 5, 2026	New application opt-in survey released
August 11, 2026	New application opt-in responses due
August 12, 2026	Application period for all applicants opens
September 5, 2026	Grant applications due
October 2025	Commission makes final award decisions

Application Requirements:

1. All applicants must review the [Grant Administration Guide](#) for specific policies and procedures related to allowable uses of grant funds, review processes, and compliance regulations.
2. New Applicants must:
 - a. Complete the formal opt-in survey by the provided deadline;
 - b. Respond to all application questions;
 - c. Complete a budget projection sheet (spreadsheet available online), which must be submitted using the original formatting and formulas included by CJC or it will not be accepted. Requested funding must align with the purpose and goals of the grant program;
 - d. Include a statement from the applicant acknowledging that any grant funds received must be expended in accordance with the allowable uses describe in OAR 213-100-0040(3)(d); and
 - e. Include a letter of commitment from each administrator of a local correctional facility or tribal correctional facility who is associated with the application, committing to participate in good faith in the grant program.

NOTE: Successful new applicants will be required to execute a grant agreement substantially in the form of the sample attached to this document.

3. Existing Grant Recipients must:
 - a. Respond to all supplemental questions;
 - b. Complete a supplemental budget adjustment sheet will all tabs completed (spreadsheet available in SM Apply), which must be submitted using the original formatting and formulas included by CJC or it will not be accepted. Requested supplemental funding must align with the purpose and goals of the grant program.

CJC's Comments Regarding Application Questions:

It is strongly recommended that applicants first read through all application questions and closely review the list of required documentation listed in the Grant Solicitation.

New Application Questions:

1. What jurisdiction(s) does your local correctional facility or tribal correctional facility serve? (Word Limit: 200 words)
2. Describe how your existing or planned medication for opioid use disorder treatment program functions, in steps. (Word Limit: 300 words)
3. Describe your existing or planned coordination with a medication for opioid use disorder treatment provider. (Word Limit: 250 words)
4. Describe how your medication for opioid use disorder treatment program aligns with, or intends to align with, best practices or standards of care related to medications for opioid use disorder treatment. (Word Limit: 250 words)
5. How does your organization currently track or plan to track your efforts to provide opioid use disorder treatment and transition planning services? What concrete measures will you use? (Word Limit: 250 words)
6. Describe your program's specific and achievable time-based goals to increase access to medications for opioid use disorder within your correctional facility. (Word Limit: 300)

Current Program Questions:

1. What jurisdiction(s) does your local correctional facility or tribal correctional facility serve? (Word limit: 100 words)
2. Describe how supplemental funds will be used to expand your existing or planned medication for opioid use disorder treatment functions, in steps. Ensure goals and

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objectives are specific, measurable, achievable, relevant, and time-bound (SMART) to the remaining grant period. (Word limit: 150 words)

3. Describe your plan to ensure the amount of supplemental funds requested will be used in their entirety by the end of the grant period, September 30, 2027, in steps. (Word limit: 150 words)

CRIMINAL JUSTICE COMMISSION JAIL-BASED MEDICATIONS FOR OPIOD USE DISORDER GRANT PROGRAM

This is Amendment No. X to Grant Agreement No. JMD-27-XX ("Agreement") between the State of Oregon, acting through its Criminal Justice Commission ("CJC" or "State"), and **Grantee Name** ("Recipient").

1. Effective Date. This Agreement shall become effective on the date that it is fully executed and approved as required by applicable law.
2. Amendment to Agreement. The Agreement is hereby amended as follows (new language is indicated in **bold** and deleted language is indicated by ~~striketrough~~):

This Agreement becomes effective only when fully signed and approved as required by applicable law ("Effective Date"). Unless extended or terminated earlier in accordance with its terms, this Agreement shall expire November 30, 2027.

A. The Grant Amount in Section 1 is amended as follows:

B. Section 3.A is amended and restated to include additional disbursements as follows:

A. Disbursement. Upon execution of this Agreement and satisfaction of all conditions precedent, CJC shall disburse Grant funds to Recipient in installments as listed:

3. Counterparts. This Amendment may be executed in two or more counterparts (by facsimile or otherwise) each of which is an original and all of which when taken together

are deemed one agreement binding on all Parties, notwithstanding that all Parties are not signatories to the same counterpart.

4. Original Agreement. Except as expressly amended above, all other terms and conditions of original Agreement remain in full force and effect. By its execution of this Amendment, Grantee certifies to CJC that the representations, warranties and certifications contained in the original Agreement are true and correct as of the effective date of this Amendment and with the same effect as though made at the time of this Amendment.
