




Ending Mass Incarceration RequiresCurbing Extreme Sentences

Life Imprisonment




 One in 7 people in U.S. prisons is serving a life sentence, totaling over 200,000 people

Black Americans as a Percentage of ...








We Are Working Towards

- Limiting virtually all maximum prison terms to 20 years.
- Taking a second look at sentences within 10 years of imprisonment.
- Require prospective and retroactive racial impact statements for all criminal statutes.











Sentencing Commissions: Be Bold!

Support Legislative Reforms

 E.g., DC Criminal Code Reform Commission: maximum sentence length of 45 years and "second look" for all after 15 years

Reform Guidelines

• E.g., U.S. Sentencing Commission: "Drugs Minus Two" Amendment applied retroactively and former Chair Patti B. Saris recommendation to eliminate mandatory minimums
